



Transgender Inclusion in Congregations: Frequently Asked Questions

Q: When does the course start and end?

A: There's no start or end date! This course is self-led. The lectures are pre-recorded, so you can watch them any time that's convenient for you, by yourself or in a group.

Even better, if you purchase the course as a congregation, your congregation gets lifetime access to it, meaning additional groups or individuals from the congregation can take the course at any time without having to pay an additional fee.

Q: My congregation wants to sign up. If we buy the course, how will everyone access it?

A: When one person buys the course on behalf of a congregation or other group, we send that person a unique link that they can share with everyone else in the congregation or group, so that everyone can access the course and create their own user account.

Q: I'm buying the course on behalf of my church. Should I use my own email address to sign up, or the church's?

A: When you purchase the course on behalf of a congregation or other group, use your own personal information to create your own user account. We'll send you a link so that everyone else in your congregation or group can do this too.

Q: I'm part of a different sort of faith group (a state advocacy network, a regional presidents' council, a cluster leadership team, etc.)—can my group take the course?

Definitely! You're welcome to go ahead and purchase the course on behalf of any faith group. We encourage you to [contact us](#) to discuss the particularities of your situation and how to best make the course work for your group.

Q: What's the best way to run the course in a congregation?

A: It completely depends on the congregation and what works best in your context. A group of people can meet (once a month for six months, or twice a month for three months, etc.) to watch each lecture and discuss it, along with the resources; or folks can watch the lectures on their own and then gather (in person or virtually) for discussion; or you could even do a weekend-long event where you alternate watching the lectures, group discussion, and individual reflection and resource reading. Consider running the course in different ways at different times and intentionally engaging different people and groups within the congregation, including the congregation's leadership.
