Scrawl is cooler than ever in 2022 with new fall dates on **October 15 & 16!** Scrawl 16 is bringing you the immersive mobile mural experience you love as well as 2 permanent murals from the city's best visual artists. To continue building the next generation of muralists, Franklinton Arts District is also introducing a brand-new emerging artist program called YEA! (Young Emerging Artists!). In addition to witnessing murals galore, you'll get to explore and purchase the works of local artists and vendors at 400 West Rich studios, Show & Sell, and Scrawl Marketplace; get down to DJ sets and breakdancing exhibitions; eat at the city's tastiest food trucks; learn about the community organizations making an impact on Franklinton; and get creative with kids' activities at Scrawl Jr.

Resource Highlight: SAFER Station

Through partnerships, the Franklin County Office of Justice Policy & Programs (OJPP) is implementing the SAFER (Stop Addiction For Everyone Resource) Station program, a First Responder Deflection program offering brief medical screening and direct linkage to substance use treatment for individuals actively using drugs and at risk for overdose in Franklin County. The SAFER multidisciplinary team works to redirect individuals using drugs away from jails or emergency departments and toward community-based treatment. Using a non-judgmental approach rooted in addiction science, SAFER stations is the gateway to treatment services when an individual reaches the "Action" Stage of Change.



Currently rolling out soft launch harm reduction events with dates to come. SAFER Station is located at 368 West Park Ave., Columbus, Ohio 43223 (COTA Stop #2691). They will open regular hours in late September, and will operate Monday-Friday from 10AM-8PM, and Saturday from 10AM-2PM.

Resource Highlight: Columbus Cancer Clinic

The Columbus Cancer Clinic provides low-cost or free head-to-toe cancer screenings, prevention, and education. They are open by appointment Monday-Friday from 8AM-4:30PM, and are located at 1699 W. Mound St., Columbus, Ohio, 43223 (LifeCare Alliance building).

Columbus Cancer Clinic provides cancer prevention services for adults including:

- Screening mammograms, diagnostic mammograms, and breast ultrasounds
- Low-cost cancer screening tests for cervical, colon, and prostate cancer according to American Cancer Society guidelines
- Preventive counseling on lifestyle changes that may reduce cancer risks
- Referrals to other health care providers for services unavailable in our office

Columbus Cancer Clinic accept Medicare, Medicaid and most major insurances. They use a sliding fee scale for low-income uninsured adults, and they do not deny care due to inability to pay. For more information, please visit: <https://lifecarealliance.org/programs/cancer-clinic/>.
