## Tu B'shvat Trivia - Rules

## HOW TO ANSWER:

1. As a team, use the clues on your table to figure out the answers. You can use the fact sheets, Torah sources, and foods to figure out your answers. Also, use your senses; touch, taste, and smell the foods, read the sheets, and listen to each other.
2. When your team is ready to answer, your whole team must perform your mascot sound and dance move.
3. Youngest teammate must present a prop and explain how it supports the team's answer
4. 2nd youngest (speaking) teammate recites the answer with no help from older teammates.
5. If the question asks for a pasuk, an older team member can recite the whole pasuk.
6. You must wait until the full question has been asked. There will be a sign.
7. Any team that "buzzes" without their the answer ready, forfeits that round.

1. How many trees grow in Central Park?
a. 26,000, including 1,700 American Elms
2. Some people make syrup from this fruit and use it a sweetener. This fruit is chewier than it first appears and has a funny yiddish name. A "rainmaker" planted one of these trees for his grandchildren. What is this fruit tree? And where do we learn this story?
a. Carobs - Taanit 23a
3. People make syrup from this fruit and use it as a sweetener. It has an inedible pit. What is this tree, and what kind of person is compared to it?
a. Dates - Tzadikim
4. This fruit is fully edible - seeds and all. What is it compared to and why?
a. Figs - because the torah has no waste
5. What are the names of 3 Catskill reservoirs where NYC gets its water from?
a. Schoharie Reservoir, Cannonsville Reservoir, Pepacton Reservoir, Ashokan Reservoir, Rondout Reservoir, Neversink Reservoir
6. This fruit has edible seeds. It's leaves were used for something special in the Torah. What is the fruit, and what was this special use?
a. Figs - to clothe Adam and Chava when they sinned.
7. What is the pasuk that tells us of the 7 species (shivat Haminim). You must sing your response as a whole team.
8. This creature is not kosher but it makes something kosher. What is the creature and why is it kosher?
a. Bees - because the honey doesn't go through their bodies.
9. This is sweet. We use this to sanctify certain days of the year. Sometimes it has seeds that are edible, sometimes they are not. King Dovid says that it makes people happy. What is this fruit? And what is the pasuk that teaches this?
a. Grapes - Tehilim 104:15
10. How much trash is in the ocean?
a. 269,000 tons of plastic trash float in the ocean.
11. This tree can live over 1500 years. It's fruits are not so sweet, but we use it some other ways. What is this fruit and what are 3 ways we use it as Jews?
a. Olives: anoint kings with oil, chanuka menorah, Beit Hamikdash, Eat olives
12. Are we allowed to remove a load of stuff from an Animal on Shabbat? If yes, why?
a. Tza'ar Ba'alei Chayim
13. Are we allowed to chop down trees or destroy things for no reason? What is this mitzvah called? According to the Rambam is it D'rabanan or D'oraita?
a. NO, Bal Tashchit, Drabanan .
14. How much water is pumped to NYC every day?
a. 1 billion gallons/day
15. Food has to travel to get from the farm to your plate. What is the total mileage of an average meal in the US?
a. $\quad 1500$ miles
16. Some people are allergic to part of this plant. It fills people up. Hashem tells us that this is the primary sustenance. What is the plant and what is the pasuk?
a. [Wheat - Tehilim 81:17]
17. How tall and wide is an "average" paper-making tree, and how many pieces of paper from that tree?
a. 45 foot tall, 8 " diameter, about 20,000 pieces of paper. Source
18. This fruit "hangs" at the bottom of the kohen's clothing. It has a thick shell. What is this fruit and what does it teach us about who don't seem religious?
a. Pomegranate - that even they have many mitzvot hiding.
19. How much trash does average american produce per day? How much is produced by the whole country? How much does the country recycle or compost?
a. USA: 254 million tons of trash
b. Compost: 87 million tons
c. 4.40 pounds of trash per person per day.
20. These fruits were so big that 1 person couldn't carry it. What was this fruit and who were the people that carried it?
a. Grapes, the meraglim

## Yalkut Shimoni on Nach 2:2

Why is the Torah compared to a fig? Because every fruit has in it something inedible: dates have pits, grapes have seeds, pomegranates have skin. But every part of the fig is edible. So too with the Torah - there is nothing inedible, as it says, there is nothing empty in it.

## Mishneh Torah, Sabbath 21:9

We may not ride on the back of an animal on Shabbat. It is a decree, lest one will cut off a twig to [prod] it. And we may not suspend [things] on an animal and one may not climb an animal while it is still day [before Shabbat] in order to sit upon it on Shabbat. And we may not lean against the side of an animal. [But leaning on something that is leaning against] the sides of an animal is permissible. One who climbed a tree on Shabbat inadvertently is allowed to come down. [If he did so] knowingly, he is forbidden to come down. And concerning an animal; even [if he climbed on it] knowingly, he should come down because of [the prohibition of] causing pain to animals. And so [too], we may discharge the load from on the back of an animal on Shabbat

And not only regarding trees, but even one who destructively breaks vessels or rips up clothing or tears down a building or seals up a spring or wastes food violates the Negative Commandment of "Do not destroy". However, he only receives stripes for disobedience, in accordance with the Rabbis.
