-Please choose a memory that is significant to you in some way, perhaps one you revisit from time to time. The memory could reference an ending, a beginning, a moment you were courageous, frightened, or excited. It can be from any age or time in your life. There are no restrictions.

-The memory does NOT have to be about Larchmont or Mamaroneck

-Memories can be written on long thin strips or rectangular art paper (provided), audio recorded or all of the above. It's easy to do! Just call this number and start speaking: **914.315.9404**. (Please keep recordings under 5 minutes).

-If English is not your native language, please feel free to write or record your memories in your native tongue.

-An "acknowledgements/thank you" page will be on the website and in the catalog. Please indicate how you would like to be acknowledged by filling out the submission form and checking either full name, first name last initial, first name only, or initials only). **Please note: Memories will NOT be linked to names. Provision of names is only for purposes of thanking you for your participation in the online catalog.**

-Please provide an email if you would like to be notified when the reception will be, when the online catalog will be available (at the end of the project), and for updates about the project. These emails will NOT be shared and will only be used to notify you about the project.
