



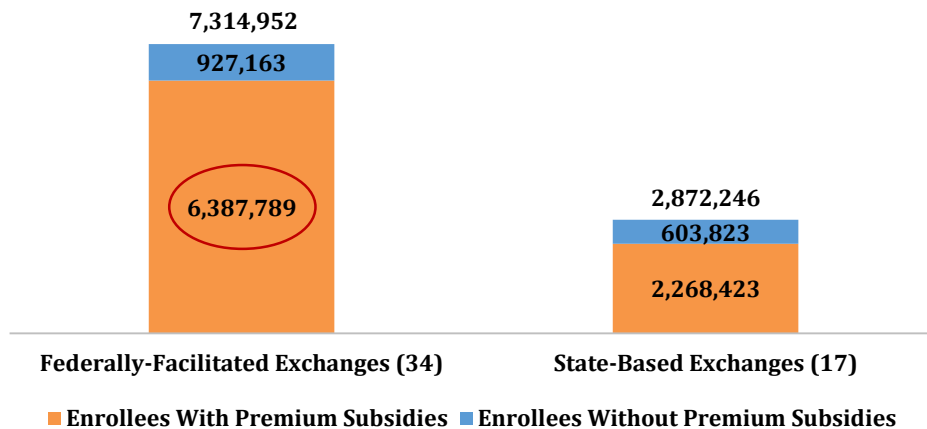
AFFORDABLE CARE ACT DASHBOARD

On June 25, 2015, the U.S. Supreme Court decided in *King v. Burwell* that the ACA's premium subsidies are specifically intended to be available in states with a federally-facilitated exchange. With the case's uncertainty resolved, lawmakers are expected to introduce a number of bills modifying and repealing certain provisions of the ACA. To help set the stage for these potential developments, CAHC offers this **July 2015 ACA Dashboard**, providing a visual and concise update of the current landscape of the ACA marketplace.

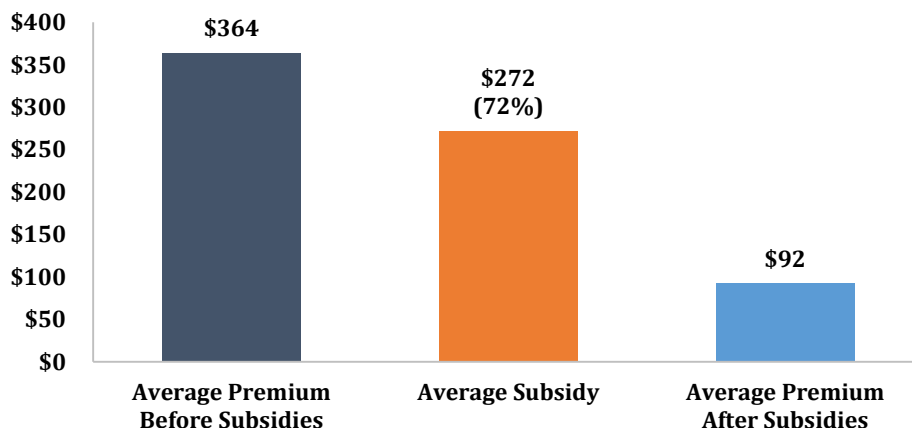
***King v. Burwell*: Premium Subsidies Continue for 6.4 Million Federal Exchange Enrollees**

Number of Exchange Plan Enrollees Receiving Subsidies by Exchange Type, 2015



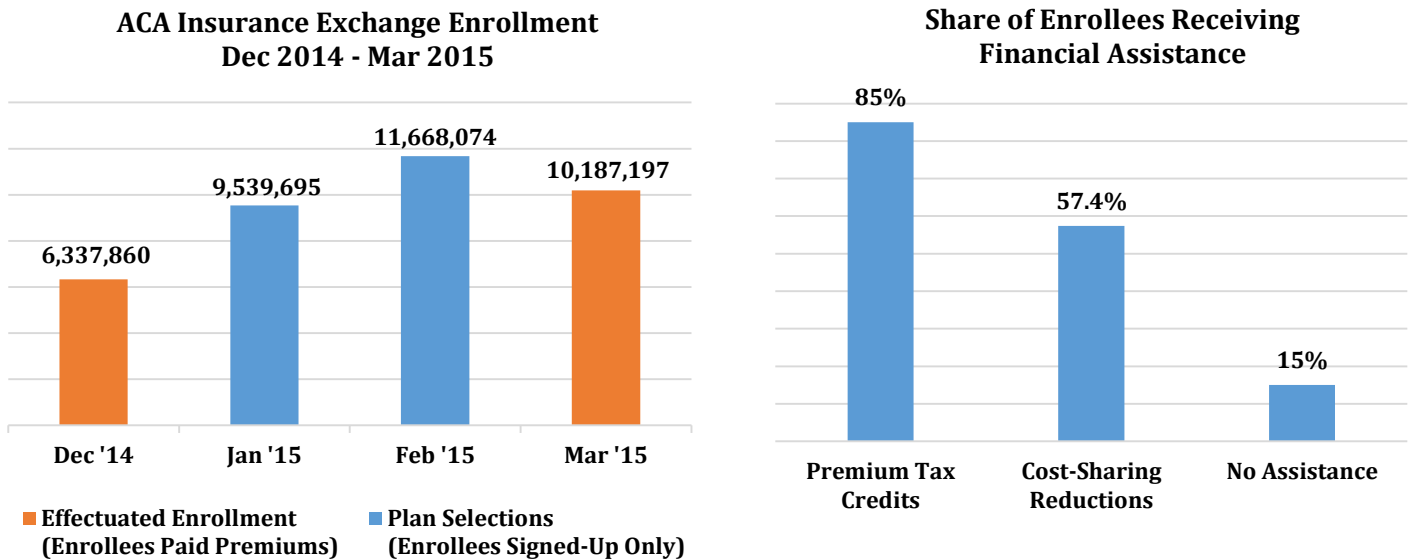

Impact of Premium Subsidies on Average Consumer Premiums for 2015 Federally-Facilitated Exchange Plans



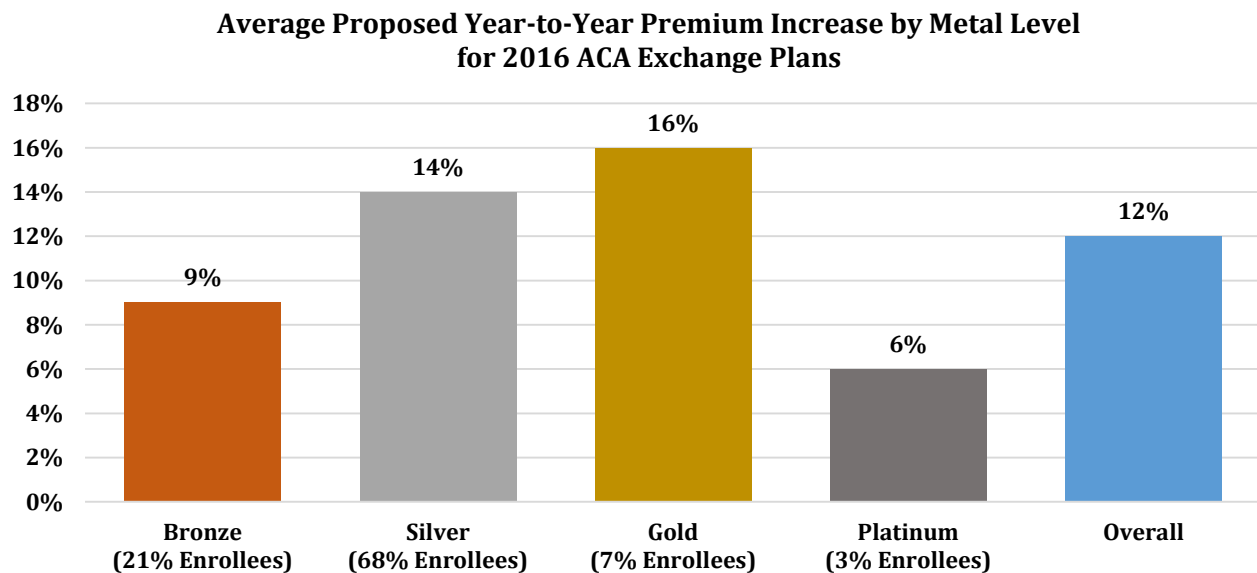

ACA Exchange Enrollment: Roughly 10.2 Million Effectuated Enrollees as of March 31



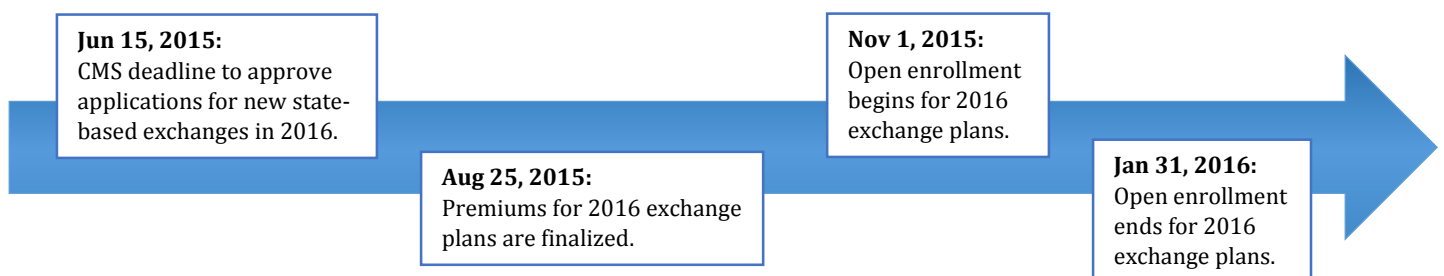

Exchange Plan Premiums: Average Proposed Premiums 12 Percent Higher for 2016

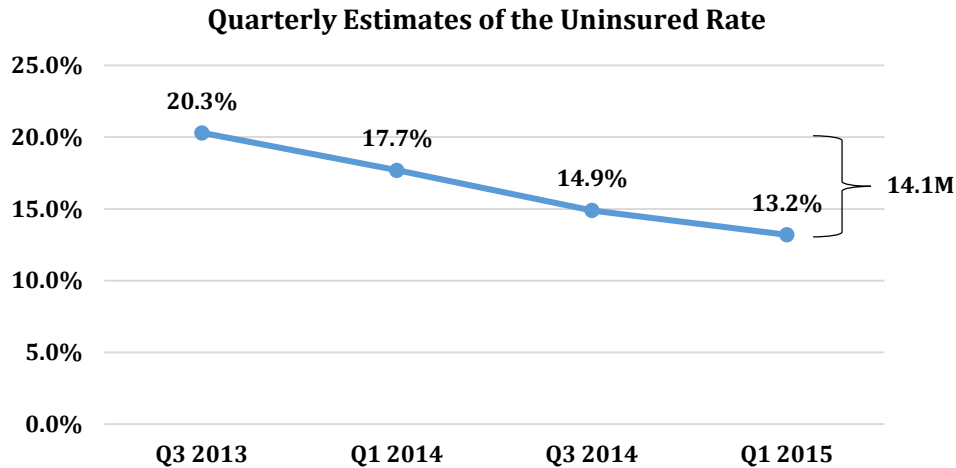

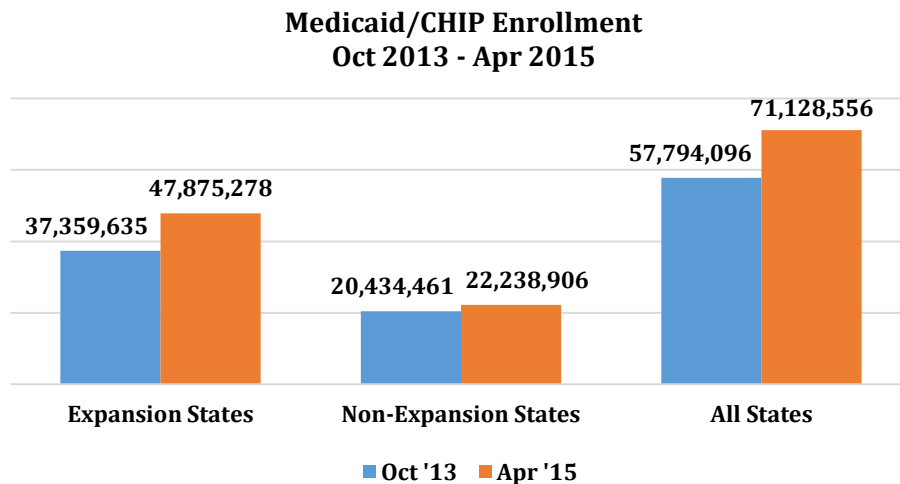


Total Impact: HHS Estimates 14.1 Million Gained Coverage Since October 2013



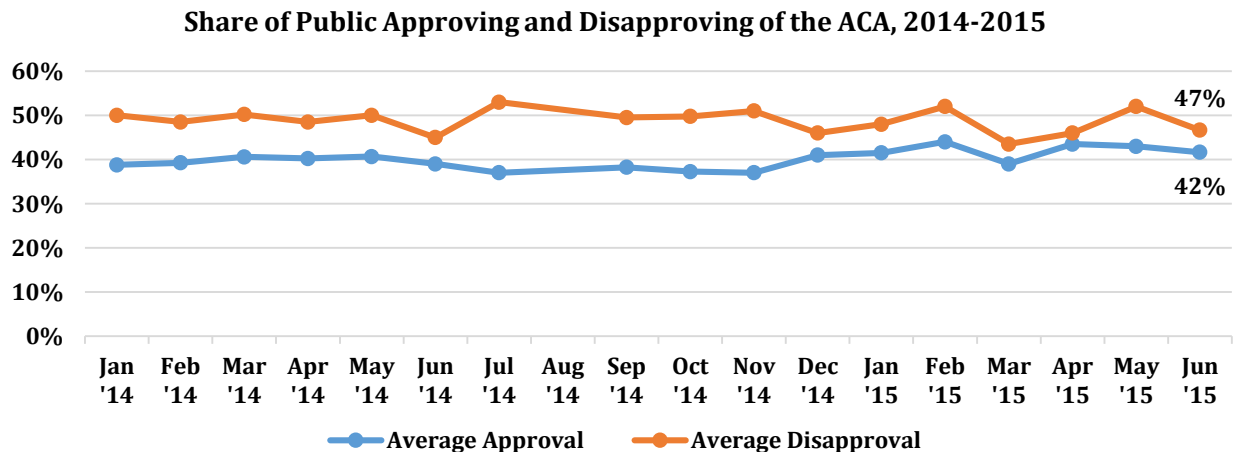
