Dear Friends of Art in Giving,

Thanks to you it's been an incredible run these last seven years since we launched Art in Giving. We wish to share with you some recent milestones.

Last year The Rachel Molly Markoff Foundation dba Art in Giving sold and leased art worth over \$420,000. As a result, the Foundation seed funded grants totalling \$210,000, doubling the amount in the previous year. May our combined efforts advance research and increase the hope desperately needed by families affected by childhood cancer.

Recent grant recipients were highlighted in our previous newsletter and included researchers affiliated with Mass General Hospital, Dana Farber and NY Medical. Over the years, grant recipients included scientists at Sloan Kettering, UCLA Medical, Stanford Medical, City Hope, Yale Medical and Johns Hopkins.

We thank you for buying or leasing fine art from the Art in Giving gallery for your building lobbies and offices and for purchasing certificates for your employees, guest speakers, family and friends. We are especially thankful to Alexandria Real Estate Equities, Inc., BioMed Realty, Equity Office in Boston and its Chicago Office, Mass Bio Council, New England BioLabs Inc., Pfizer, Raymond James, Sanofi/Genzyme, Sherin and Lodgen and Skanska.

We congratulate the many artists selected by our clients and thank them for their generous contribution of 50% of their proceeds to the Foundation. In addition to our artists, we are collaborating with Galerie Vendome in France (Nice and Paris) and Galerie d'Orsay in Boston.

We are fortunate to have a wonderful board of advisors and express our appreciation for their dedication and commitment to our mission.

On a personal note, we are most grateful to all of you for helping to keep Rachel's memory alive.

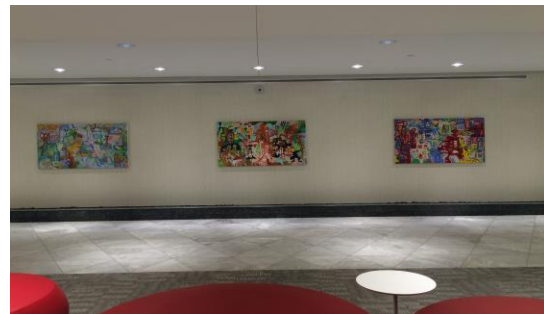
