2022/2023-Dr. Suzanne Baker, St Jude Children's Research Hospital

Diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma (DIPG) is a devastating brain tumor that arises in the brainstem and occurs almost exclusively in children. The research will help us evaluate how entire networks of genes are turned on or off.

2019/2021- Dr. Mariella G. Filbin, MD, PhD- Assistant Professor of Pediatrics, Harvard Medical School and Associate Member, Broad Institute of Harvard and MIT

Our research will define relevant tumor-immune interactions that will further our understanding of pediatric brain tumors and pave the road for developing next generation immune therapies to overcome the current limitations of primary and secondary resistance to immunotherapy.

2017/2018 Dr. Jaime Chu, MD Assistant Professor of Pediatrics, Division of Hepatology, Icahn Hepatology, Icahn School of Medicine of Mount Sinai

A defining hallmark of glioblastoma cells is their ability to alter cell metabolism to evade cell death and escape most available therapies. Our work aims to uncover new roles for mannose metabolism in glioblastoma cell growth, and ways to manipulate these pathways in order to improve efficacy of radiation therapy and treatment outcomes for children with glioblastoma.
