The 27th session of the International Advisory Committee for Biosphere Reserves (IACBR) was held between 8 and 12 March.

The IACBR provides scientific and technical advice to UNESCO's Director-General and the MAB-ICC regarding the World Network of Biosphere Reserves, such as the designation of new sites and periodic reviews. We are anxiously awaiting the news about the success of our nomination.

5-Year Strategic Plan

Collaboration is at the heart of our organization. As such, our strategic plan was informed by eight years of conversations and dialogue across the Átl'ka7tsem/Howe Sound Biosphere Region (AHSBR) with First Nations, civil society, multi-sector stakeholders, and all levels of government. In response to the key systemic challenges in the region, we are focusing on three outcomes over the next 10 years:

Sustainable Development: An overarching, holistic land and marine
use plan, mutually recognized and respected by First Nations, civil
society, multi-sector stakeholders, and all levels of government.

- Biodiversity Conservation: Needs are understood and defined, and measures are in place to ensure the conservation of critical ecological values.
- Reconciliation, Equity & Inclusion: Needs and meaning for the Squamish Nation and all nations and communities in the region are learned and defined collaboratively, and plans for advancement are mutually supported.

To achieve our 10-year outcomes, we need to focus on and achieve four interim outcomes over the next five years, as described in our strategic plan.

Embedding Marine Education

Kids who grow up near the shoreline might take for granted the fact that they have access to one of the world's best playgrounds. Educators who teach in ocean communities just might forget that they have access to one of the world's greatest teaching resources.

In response to great community feedback about the educational value of the Ocean Watch Howe Sound Edition Reports (2017 & 2020), Oceanwise has created a seven-week curriculum for middle school students to deepen their learning about Átl'ka7tsem/ Txwnéwu7ts/ Howe Sound. Teachers can access a three-hour workshop to get classroom-ready with the curriculum.

It is our goal to ensure this valuable resource as part of the curriculum of every school in the region.


The seven-week curriculum taps into core competencies for Grade 7 in Language Arts and Science, including big ideas like evolution, climate, and its change over the earth's geologic time; while tapping into critical core competencies including communication, creative thinking, critical thinking and social responsibility.



Cumulative Effects Project wrap up

March 5, 2021 we hosted a wrap-up over Zoom of the Cumulative Effects Pilot Project for Howe Sound. Representatives from the Ministry of Forests Lands Natural Resources and Rural Development shared their findings and provided a demonstration of the soon-to-be-launched Stewardship Baseline Objectives Tools.
