From our Interim Rector

A message from Fr John

Dear Friends in Christ:

Summer is quickly coming to a close. I hope it has been a time of refreshment and relaxation for you and your family. We continue to move through the interim time at Christ Church, Ithan and there are some developments I want to share with you.



First, your Vestry has been remarkable! They have been so supportive of me and I think we have made great progress in keeping our Vestry meetings prayerful, focused and informative. Every meeting is an open forum where everyone shares freely and transparency is a primary goal.

One of the challenges we have faced head on is the lack of committee structure here and how we can create a sense of ownership of all aspects of our church's life by all of our members. To that end, I am happy to report that we now have two committees: Buildings and Grounds and Finance/Stewardship/Planned Giving Committees. Property and finance are two main responsibilities of the Vestry and it is important that we have more voices at the table as we deal with the challenges ahead in both of these areas. The membership of these two committees can be found elsewhere in this newsletter. A third committee was also formed because of a need that arose. That committee is the Memorial Garden Committee.

This is an exciting time as we chart a new course. Let us support each other during this time by our active participation and let us pray intentionally for the Spirit's direction for our work together.



One feature of Julia and Porter's library are story hours. Among the first story hour readers was Nancy Churchman, who recently retired as a much beloved first grade teacher at Radnor Elementary School.

The Squirrel Problem at Church

Colket Bequest

From time to time, Christ Church is blessed by parishioners who choose to remember our church in their wills. Their stewardship is a remarkable testimony to their enduring love for Christ Church, Ithan and a way to insure that our mission continues in this place long after they are gone. We are pleased to provide this report about a recent bequest we have received.

Tristram Colket was a parishioner of Christ Church, Ithan, until he died in the 1980s. He included Christ Church, Ithan, among six beneficiaries of his estate, to be distributed after the death of his wife, which occurred in 2014.

The trustees of his estate first contacted us in January 2015 – but the processes that the trustee (Wells Fargo Bank) was required to follow kept us from receiving any cash for a very long time.

The total we expect to receive is about \$600,000. A first payment in the amount of \$400,000 was received in January 2015, with a “promise” that we would receive the balance during the summer of 2016. (We have not yet received the balance, and we are close to the end of the summer.)

Several years ago, the vestry adopted a resolution that all bequests would be added to our Revocable Trust, which is managed



by the Church Foundation. The vestry also voted to receive from the Revocable Trust as income, 1% of the balance in the Trust at the end of the prior year.

When we received the \$400,000 from the Colket bequest, the vestry opted to devote 10% of that amount (\$40,000) for charitable contributions and to deposit the balance (\$360,000) in the Revocable Trust. So far, we have made one contribution (to the charity *Stand with Iraqi Christians*), in the amount of \$2,000, from the charitable contribution portion.

We are so grateful to Tristram Colket for his generous gift to Christ Church. May his witness be an inspiration to all of us to be good stewards of the resources with which we have been blessed. May we share generously from our abundance and make a return to God for those blessings. Please consider remembering Christ Church, Ithan in your will or through a planned gift of your choice. And please do remember Mr. & Mrs. Colket in your prayers.
