A message from Fr John

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Christ Church, Ithan,

As I write this letter for our Fall newsletter, there are so many things on my mind. I wasn't expecting to be here as our transition timeline anticipated a call to a new Rector by now. As you know, that call did not happen and



it seems that God had another plan for Christ Church, Ithan and for me! Our mutual discernment has placed us on another path, an exciting and adventurous one. Our Holy Covenant presented at the parish meeting on September 24th will guide our journey together over the next couple of years as we seek to better define our mission and purpose and thus allow Christ Church, Ithan to be more focused and clear in calling their next priest.

Our Holy Covenant seeks to grow our relationship with God, our relationship with each other as a Christian community and our relationship with our local community and wider world. These relationships will be the focus of our efforts and your Vestry is already engaged in real work to address these three areas. Everything we do will seek to advance these goals and through a process of experimentation and collaboration, we hope to grow our church and creatively and energetically become a faith community that is alive with God's love.

I can't emphasize enough how much we need each and every one of you to engage in the work that your Vestry will be leading. This is a time to be intentional about your involvement here and to clearly communicate with your leadership what you want your church to be and what excites you about the initiatives in which we will be engaged. Above all, we need to proceed prayerfully

The full Choir will sing. (This is a first for the early service!)

The Quintet of Professional Singers will sing, accompanied by harp.

A program of Christmas Music will be sung 20 minutes before the service begins.

Advent Wreath Making

Advent is just around the corner. That means it's time to order the supplies to create a beautiful table Advent wreath. We will be making Advent wreaths on the first Sunday of Advent, December 3, and everyone is invited!

If you have a wreath form tucked away somewhere, dig that one out. If not, simply sign up in the back of the church or in the parish hall and we will purchase you a new one. You can also sign up for a set of Advent candles.

Anyone who has greens in their yard, small, natural decorative items (dried flower clusters, cones, shells, pods, etc.), or narrow ribbon to use to decorate the wreaths, please bring them on December 3rd. Also bring your gardening clippers if you have a pair, we will supply the wire, extra clippers, and hot glue guns and will show everyone how to make this simple and beautiful table wreath.



The cost of the wreath form is \$4.00, the set of four Advent candles is \$6.00.

If you know anyone who can't make it to church but would like a wreath, please let Cynthia know and we will make a wreath to be delivered to them.



Sunday, December 17th immediately following the 10:00am service will be our annual Greening of the Church. Please plan to join as we put up the trees and decorations. It's a lovely time full of joy and fellowship.

Friday December 22nd creating the fresh flower arrangements for our church's beautiful Christmas celebration. We will meet in the church basement at 10:00 am to make the floral arrangements for the candles that line the aisle, the brass container for the vestibule, and the candle rings for the windows (no previous experience necessary). We'll meet at 10:00 am.

Saturday December 23rd placing the flower arrangements and the poinsettias in the sanctuary as the finishing touches to once again make Christ Church Ithan the prettiest little church on the main line. We'll meet at 10:00 am.


what we've found.
