Therefore, with all this in mind, please enter your car!



1. If you enter your car for "Exhibit Only" you may not ask to have it judged on the date of the event, but can change that election no later than August 10, 2023.

2. If you enter your car to be judged and opt to not have it judged, that election can be made on event date.

3. If you enter your car in a PCA Class you can not switch to one of the SMMC Classes after August 10, 2023

Interesting Entries



1963 Volkswagen Karmann Ghia Type 34 Razor Owner: Bruce Hoel, Los Angeles, CA This model of Karmann Ghia featured a 1500cc engine and was never imported to the United States. It was designed to be a transition car for those VW customers that were driving Beetles but looking for a larger family sized car.



1963 Ford Thunderbird Principality of Monaco Owner: Jerry Bieser, San Juan Capistrano, CA

Ford Commissioned Princess Grace to do the Color Combination inside and Outside. It's a limited car production of only 2000. This car is numbered #263 out of 2000. Original except the exterior paint. Engine rebuilt Original Interior and vinyl top.



932 Packard Series 900 Convertible Coupe Owner: Gordon Logan, Georgetown, TX Packard introduced the Series 900 in early 1932 in an attempt to respond to the Depression with a lower-cost automobile. Discontinued after only one year, a mere 6,785 were built; therefore, the distinctive and unique shovel-nosed "Light Eight" is highly regarded by collectors, particularly in this Convertible Coupe body style (with rumble seat), of which only an estimated 1,000 were built.

It was built to Packard standards of quality and powered by a 110hp version of Packard's 320 ci Straight Eight engine. Wheelbase is 127.75 inches; it weighs 4,115 pounds, 455 pounds lighter than the larger Packards, making it the best performer in the 1932 Packard model lineup.

This car was originally sold in Cleveland, OH but found its way to Connecticut, California, Nevada and Florida until brought to Texas. The prior owner purchased the car to run in the 2004 Great Race from Jacksonville, FL to California. Added to the Sport Clips Collection in 2006, car was toured extensively until complete frame-off restoration by Jeff's Resurrections of Taylor, Texas. Completed in May 2023 just in time to win Best in Class at the Keels & Wheels Concours.



1936 Packard Series 1407 Owner: Ricardo da Rosa, San Diego, CA



1967 Chevrolet Corvette Owner: Michael Keating, Huntington Beach, CA



1957 Ford Del Rio Station Wagon Owner: Dan Weiss, Glendale, CA

This 1957 Ford Del Rio station wagon was Ford's answer to the Chevrolet Nomad. While Chevy's Nomad was and is considered brilliant styling, the Ford outsold them 42,000 to 7,000 roughly, yet the Del Rio is relatively unknown and less collected. This car was a rescue and completely restored over 3 years.



1940 Packard Series 180 Super 8 Bohman & Schwartz Owner: Steve Snyder, Orange, CA

The 1940 Packard Super 8 Convertible Victoria was custom bodied by Bohman and Schwartz of Pasadena, and sold new through Hollywood, California Packard Dealer W. H. Collins in September,1940. Everything on the body is custom save grill, hood and dashboard! The original owner was Tom Lyle Williams, founder of Maybelline cosmetics. Bill Snyder flew to Missouri in 1971, bought the un-restored car and drove it home to Orange County! After the 1994 restoration, it won "Packard award of Excellence" at Gilmore CCCA. won class at Meadowbrook, was shown at the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance, and achieved CCCA national first.

1933 Packard 12 Series 1006 Sport Phaeton by Dietrich Owner: Singleton Collection, Costa Mesa, CA

For 1932 the Twin Six Packard was only a modest success. By year's end, just 549 had been built. Many consumers confused this twelve cylinder designation as a six cylinder engine. For 1933, the company retrenched a bit. The Standard Eight and Deluxe Eight were renamed Eight and Super Eight, respectively. The V-12 name returned, called simply the Packard Twelve.

Packard production for 1933 ended in August with just 520 Twelves being built. Of the 520, the Individual Custom line was the lowest production numbers of all body styles, often only reaching single-digit production. It is believed that only three Dietrich Sport Phaetons were ever produced for 1933. This 1933 Packard 1006 Twelve Sport Phaeton was delivered new to an unknown customer at Packard's New York City branch on April 1st, 1933. This 1933 Sport Phaeton produced by Dietrich is reported to be the New York City Auto Show example, the other two heading to other major City Auto Shows.

By the 1960s this Sport Phaeton was purchased by Rhode Island collector George Waterman, who then sold the Packard to Peter R. Ross in 1978. it has passed through multiple noted collectors' hands since, including Otis Chandler and John O'Quinn. Never fully frame-off resorted but tastefully maintained and enjoyed.



1972 Volvo 1800E Owner: Tom Carlisle, Moorpark, CA

This "Classic" 72 Volvo 1800E is not considered a sports car but rather a GT 2+2. One of only 45,000 produced over an 11-year period 61-72. This one being produced in its last year of production 1972, one of only 1840. This 1972 (one year only) color for this particular car is one of only 16 produced in 1972, being only 1 of 4 known to still exist. The color code #109 Ocean Mist Green being the rarest for the Volvo 1800.

The Volvo was found in a San Diego garage after being stored in a Tennessee garage since 2000. After is purchase in 2016 a four-year complete refurbishment performed by the owner in his home garage in Moorpark with original Volvo parts. The complete refurbishment included minor bodywork, complete drivetrain, engine compartment, all moldings, rubber bits, windows, and complete interior, dash, gauges, carpeting, headliner and original Volvo 1800 AM Radio. Fortunately, the paint on the car (resprayed by the former owner in its original #109 color) was in excellent condition.

Rebuilt 4-cylinder w/150 hp, factory Bosch Electronic Fuel Injection, factory 4 speed transmission w/overdrive, factory Dana 30 rear end refitted w/ 3.73 Tru-Trac limited slip differential and factory 4-wheel disc brakes

Couple of 1800 interesting notes...

The Volvo 1800 was the car driven by Sir Roger Moore in the long running 1960s television show... "The Saint"

The 1800 also holds the world record for recorded mileage on a single car of...3.25 million miles.

This car alone was also used by Volvos Swedish Cyan Racing Team in the world introduction of the new 2019 "Cyan Racing Team" version of its 500hp 1800 to the Los Angeles Press in 2020.

Planning for the San Marino Motor Classic.

The San Marino Motor Classic will be held on the Sunday following car week in Monterey. The reason for this is to provide collectors from other parts of the country to easily and economically ship their cars from Monterey to San Marino. Car storage is available at the collection of Aaron Weiss that is located about 2.5 miles from Lacy Park. Storage is available for as much as two weeks following the event such that exhibitors can negotiate favorable rates on the shipment of their cars back to their homes. Please contact Aaron Weiss if you will be needing to store your car and Reliable Carriers if you need car shipment.

Trailer parking is available at Huntington Middle School approximately 3 blocks from Lacy Park. The lot opens at 12:00PM on Friday, August 25th and all cars must be removed by 12:00PM on Monday, August 28th.

Lodging at all price levels is available throughout neighboring Pasadena. Please refer to our website for a list of hotels.

Car weekend begins on Saturday at noon with a tour of David Lee's collection of award-winning Ferraris. Tickets are limited to 50 and can be purchased on the San Marino Motor Classic Web Site. A tour bus will transport participants from Lacy Park to David Lee's collection and back again. Bus will leave at 12:00PM and return to Lacy Park at 3:00PM

At 4:00PM – 6:00PM on Saturday at Lacy Park, the San Marino Motor Classic will host the Automotive Fine Arts Society Art Expo and Sale. Admittance is free. Wine and snacks will be served.

Immediately following the Art Expo and Sale, will be the Symphony of Cars Gala also at Lacy Park. This event requires reservations at \$275.00/person. Admittance includes an open hosted bar, musical presentation of 15 collector cars and an orchestra playing musical compositions written in the year of the car's manufacture. A three-course meal follows with paired wine. The bar will be open throughout the evening. Sunday morning between 6:00AM – 8:30AM Lacy Park opens for the placement of cars on the show field. The gates open to the public at 9:00AM.

There will be food services available as well as a VIP Reception that includes a wine and beer bar and a gourmet luncheon under the shade of umbrellas.

The Awards ceremony will commence at 1:00PM and the event will conclude with the presentation of the Best in Show Awards at 3:00PM.

If you plan to arrive in town prior to August 26th there is a lot of attractions in Pasadena and San Marino.

The Huntington Library, Art Museum and Botanical Gardens is located in San Marino. One could easily spend the day walking through the over 200 acres of manicured gardens and the art collection housed in Henry Huntington's mansion. There are food services available.

The Norton Simon Art Museum is located on Colorado Boulevard in Old Town Pasadena. If one watches the Rose Parade on New Year's Day, the building in the background is the Norton Simon Museum. Plan to spend approximately 2 hours in the museum before taking a walk down Colorado Boulevard where over one hundred restaurants and bars are waiting for you.

Next door to the Norton Simon Museum is the home of our Presenting Sponsor, Rusnak Autoe Group where you can purchase a Rolls-Royce, Bentley, Jaguar, Porsche, Volvo. Maserati, or Audi. Their friendly and knowledgeable sales staff will give you exceptional service

The Petersen Automotive Museum and the Nethercutt Collection is about a one-hour drive from Pasadena. Please note that the two venues are at opposite ends of Los Angeles. Driving time between the two could be as much as 1.5 hours depending on the time of day.
