TO OUR VISITORS

eclipse tips

On August 21, 2017, Idaho will experience its first total solar eclipse in 38 years. Ketchum and Sun Valley lie in the "path of totality," the area where the total eclipse will occur. Hotels are sold out and communities like ours that lie in the path are expecting a huge influx of travelers. We will likely see the largest number of visitors to our communities during this event. Visitors will start to arrive as early as Aug. 17 so please be prepared early.

STOCK UP ON ESSENTIAL PROVISIONS

Grocery stores, gas stations, restaurants, bus service, retail stores and medical clinics will experience an increase in business. Stock up on

water, groceries and fuel before the weekend.

AVOID DRIVING

Heavy traffic will affect commute times and parking availability. Find a parking area on the map inside and take the shuttle to town. Better yet, ride a bike!

DO NOT RELY ON CELL SERVICE OR INTERNET ACCESS


Due to increased volumes, cell towers are expected to experience slow or loss of connectivity.

PROTECT YOUR EYES

One of the most important safety tips for everyone, even those outside of the "path of totality," is to have proper eclipse eyewear to prevent permanent eye injury. Purchase them at local businesses now, before they sell out.

SIGNAGE FOR YOUR PROPERTY

You may want to place signage on your property to let non-locals know your property boundaries.



PLAN FOR AN EMERGENCY

Traffic volumes are expected to be heavy, which will delay response time to an emergency. Have a plan to meet if you and your family/group are separated. Have a first aid kit ready, be patient and remain calm. Only call 9-1-1 in case of an emergency. For non-emergency calls, dial 208-578-3831.

KNOW THE REGULATIONS

If you are renting out or allowing visitors to park or stay on your property for the eclipse, please ensure you are in compliance with local laws and regulations. Visit Ketchum and Sun Valley City Halls for assistance.

TAKE CARE OF YOUR PETS

We love your pets but you may want to consider leaving them safely at home to avoid the possibility of heat exhaustion.

SAFETY IN THE BACKCOUNTRY

- Tell someone where you are going and when you expect to return
- Pack extra food and water
- Bring a first aid kit
- Dress appropriately and bring clothing for changes in weather
- Bring a map and compass
- Stay hydrated
- Use sunscreen
- Take cover under lightning
- Assume you will have no cell service
- If lost, retrace route back to the trailhead and wait to be found
