2023 RS Tera North American Championship

Jordanelle State Park, Heber City, Utah September 8-10, 2023 Organizing Authority Park City Sailing Association

1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing 2021-2024 and the RS Tera Class Rules and this Notice Of Race, except as any of these are changed by the Sailing Instructions or any appendices to the Sailing Instructions.
- 1.2. Rule 40.1 (PFDs required) will be in effect. Note that Flag Y may not be displayed. This changes Rule 40.2

2. ADVERTISING

- 2.1 Advertising permitted in accordance with class rules and World Sailing Regulation 20.
- 2.2 Boats may be required to display advertising supplied by the Organizing Authority

3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 The regatta is open to all boats of the RS Tera Class
- 3.2 All competitors must be a current member of the RS Tera North America Class Association. Join the Class at https://theclubspot.com/renew-interstitial/IDk0FFC2M7
- 3.3 Registration must be completed online at: https://store.sailpc.org/products/2023-rs-tera-north-american-championships?variant=43758441857242
- 3.4 Early entry fee is \$150 per boat prior to midnight MDT, July 15, 2023, After July 15, 2023, the entry fee will be \$175. Entry fee includes a regatta t-shirt, awards, class administration, hospitality and race management.
- 3.5 Registration will open no later than May 15, 2023. Entry closes on Friday, September 1, 2023 at 1700 hours. Late entries after the deadline may be accepted at the discretion of the Organizing Authority.
- 3.6 A Waiver and Release form for all competitors must be completed and signed by the responsible parent or guardian electronically through the registration link.
- 3.7 PRO and SPORT Rigs will sail in separate fleets

4 FLIGHT SELECTION QUALIFICATIONS AND CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES FOR SPORT FLEET

4.1 On Saturday, September 9, the Sport Fleet will compete in a flight selection series (Qualification Series) and a Championship Series with Gold and Silver Flights on Sunday, September 10. The Gold and Silver Flights for the Championship Series will be determined by the final results of the Qualifications Series. The top 50% of the regatta entrants will be assigned to the Gold Flight and the remaining 50% to the Silver Flight. In the event of an odd number of competitors, the median finisher shall be assigned to the Gold Flight.

5 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

5.1 The Sailing Instructions will be available online at the Notice Board on or before 1700 hours, Friday, September 1.

6 VENUES

- 6.1 The Starting Area(s) for all fleets will be South and/or Southeast of the Personal Watercraft Ramp at Jordanelle State Park as detailed in the Sailing Instructions
- 6.2 The Regatta Office will be the Lakeview Center adjacent to the parking lot of the Personal Watercraft Ramp at Jordanelle State Park.

7 SUPPORT, COACHING AND COACH BOATS

- 7.1 All coaches and support boats shall register at the Check In table prior to the competitors' meeting
- 7.2 Team leaders, coaches and other support personnel shall stay outside areas where boats are racing from the time of the preparatory signal until all boats have finished the race or the race committee signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment.
- 7.3 A MANDATORY MEETING for all support and coach boats will take place immediately following the skippers' meeting.

8 PRIZES

- 8.1 1st through 5th overall trophies will be awarded for each SPORT and PRO Fleet
- 8.2 The RS Tera North American Championship perpetual trophies will be awarded to the winners of each SPORT and PRO Fleet.

9 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

9.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. (See Rule 3. Decision to Race.) The Organizing Authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the EVENT

10 RIGHT TO USE NAMES AND LIKENESS

10.1By participating in the RS Tera North American Championship, all competitors (by parents or legal guardians of minors) acknowledge that they grant the Organizing Authority, the Sponsors and the National and International Class Associations the unconditional right and authority, in perpetuity, to publish and broadcast anywhere in the world, for any purpose and in any media, the names, images, and biographical information relating to the competitors and photographs, video footage and audio recordings taken of the boat and skipper prior to, during, and after the races without compensation.

11 QUAGGA MUSSEL CERTIFICATION

11.1 All Watercraft (Coach, Spectator, Charter and Competitor) must certify and are subject to inspection in compliance with the State of Utah 2023 Mussel Aware Boater program.
