

Join us for Charlotte's May Day march on May 3rd, 2025, starting at 4938 Central Ave. The march will end at Kilborne Park, located at 2600 Kilborne Dr

May 1st is International Worker's Day, also known as May Day, and the following Saturday on May 3rd we are celebrating and uplifting all immigrants and working people in our communities who make the Queen City a social and economic powerhouse in "The New South".

Why We March

We are showing up for all working people in our community, regardless of where they were born, who have been impacted by federal cuts, executive orders, and community destroying/anti- worker policies that have been curated and executed by unelected billionaires, and their elected co-conspirators, seeking to further enrich themselves through our hard earned wages and our collective labor.

From social security and medicaid/medicare to devastating immigration policies, the firing of federal workers, attacks on the National Labor Relations Board and against unions, and permanent tax breaks to billionaires, WE, the working people, are coming together to affirm that WE are the source of true political, social, and economic power in this country.

We will be marching on Central Avenue, the "heart" of East Charlotte, passing through several immigrant communities, areas of gentrification, and small businesses owned and operated by our neighbors. MUTUAL AID PROJECT

Mutual Aid is a new addition to the many "Good Works" of ICLT. Mutual Aid's focus will be assisting the LGBTQ+, Black and Brown and Immigrant Communities, in Charlotte. We will provide information, guidance, and opportunities to be involved with these communities going forward. Here are two organizations that I'd like to introduce and hope that you will assist ICLT in providing support.

QC Family Tree is a neighborhood based community organization based in the Enderly Park neighborhood in West Charlotte. Since Enderly Park is in the heart of a food desert, the organization has set up the Freedom Fridge which allows neighbors to access fresh fruits/vegetables and canned goods, pasta, breakfast items, etc.

Our goal is to provide food for the Fridge on a bimonthly basis from April through July. We will reassess the needs at the end of that time period. To find out more about this organization check their website at qcfamilytree.org

WE'RE A FORCE! Over 1,090 Caller Activists have signed up for Every Call Counts by now. So many of us are faithfully obtaining scripts and making calls every week. YOU RESISTERS ROCK!!!

ON THE MAP: In NC we have 746 Every Call Counts volunteers, while 345 are found across nearly every state in the country. People everywhere are looking to get engaged and sharing the link.

THE HOTTEST ISSUES: In NC there are over 70 Bills currently active. It's hard to choose the top 10 issues each week for our Resister Callers. How do we prioritize? In this order: Elections and Voter suppression, immediacy of the vote in the House, legislative power grabs, immigration/ guns / DEI. There are no small issues, but maintaining democracy and the balance of power is the cornerstone for all other legislation and protections.

NEW PROCESS: The Every Call Counts team has started authoring the scripts themselves for North Carolina. Additionally, they are indicating the progress of legislation so that we can know the urgency of making our calls.

COLLABORATION: The Every Call Counts team has started collaborating with NC Democratic Party. How? The NCDP training department is using Every Call Counts scripts and process in their volunteer training. They are also distributing our mobilize link resulting in additional volunteers. Meantime, the ECC team is sharing NCDP training information with Indivisible Charlotte volunteers on facebook. Win/Win!!

TEAM UPDATES: Our precious Linda Meigs will be leaving the team in a few weeks so that she and David can continue their work in the State of Virginia. Linda has been a true gem for the ECC team and they both have been invaluable to ICLT during a critical time for NC elections. We will miss you Linda and David!

- Communicate with attendees
- Assess protest need for safety vs visibility
- Prepare for counter protestors and de-escalate charged situations if needed
- Alert press if desired





Hello and thank you for registering for our town hall last Thursday! Sen. Tillis was invited by certified mail, in person by two coalition members on a flight back from DC, and from hundreds of constituents who emailed him personally, asking him to come hear our concerns. Despite all of this, we received no official response from him or his team. We chose this date because it was during a two week Senate recess specifically meant for constituent work. So we have to ask: WHERE IS TILLIS?

If you were able to attend, we hope that you were moved by the personal stories and testimonies from your fellow residents. We heard from many folks who have been impacted by Sen. Tillis' inaction in the face of the destruction of our government programs that we rely on to make our lives work. Folks are being impacted an incredibly wide range of ways: students afraid of ICE in their school, families who rely on the VA for health and mental health, from folks who rely on the Dept. of Education to ensure that their child receives the extra help that they need in the classroom, from business owners who are facing economic devastation due to federal cuts and looming trade war, and many, many more.

But something else also happened that night: we saw about 650 people gather together to bear witness to their neighbors' pain and worries. And to FIGHT for each other. THAT is what we can take forward from this night: Sen. Tillis was not there for us, and has shown that he will not show up, not in person or in congress to work for us. But we will.

IN THE KNOW: Media Bias - How Media Savvy Are You?

Indivisible CLT Media Bias Project- Update!

Indivisible Charlotte's project to help our members better assess media bias was introduced in a previous *In the Know* article <u>Media Bias: Fact or Fiction?</u> Here's an update

on our progress and some detailed information on how to assess facts, analysis and opinions. Also provided is some information on as well as the challenges of using the three media bias tools identified for national and international news.

Tightening up our view: Facts vs Opinion (Source: Google's Al tool Gemini V2.0 Flash)

- **Factual reporting-** relies on evidence and objectivity and should be presented without opinions or biases. It should be balanced providing multiple views. The evidence should come from credible sources and be accurate.
 - News analysis explains the facts and implications. If it relies on evidence and objectivity noted above, it can be considered factual. Analysis inconsistent with evidence and objectivity is a form of opinion.
- Opinion Sources that express views and perspectives often from an ideological position (e.g. right, center left). The analysis and interpretation can be affected by ideology and are aimed at persuading the audience. In effect they are advocating and mobilizing support for a particular cause, policy, political position or political party/movement.
- Distinction between Fact and Opinion- There should be a clear distinction in a
 news source between factual articles and opinion (e.g. editorial) articles. The use
 and presentation of certain facts is often influenced by the writer. The aim of
 factual reporting is to inform the audience, while the aim of
 opinion/commentary is to persuade the audience.

Some things to keep in mind:

- It is critical to be able to determine whether an article or report is fact or opinion since news sources often tend to blur the distinction between them.
- Therefore, it's important to rely on various news sources to be well informed.

 Exposing yourself to news sources from across the political spectrum (right, center, left) will help you develop a better understanding and appreciation of an issue.
- Since most political success in a democracy is based on compromise, understanding views from across the political spectrum can also help engineer more successful policy proposals (Note: there are always non-negotiables such as the Constitution, the rule of law and civil rights).

Media Bias Tools: Friend or Foe?

Two specific tools are available on the internet and our team has created an AI based search tool. These tools are not perfect. It's important to do your own "gut check" based on the Fact vs Opinion Tools above, rather than taking our (or the tool's) word for it. Some of the challenges include:

- Some of these tools are based on participant or analyst votes or assessments, which might be biased as well.
- The tools do not include all news sources. As news sources have widened from traditional newspapers, news magazines, radio and television to podcasts and Substack, it's impossible to capture everything.
- The tools do not distinguish between different news presenters. This is particularly
 important for television and radio news that blends news and opinion. If you watch
 MSNBC or listen to POTUS on Sirius Radio, there are different nuanced perspectives
 and fact/opinion mixes for different shows.
- The AI tool draws information and perspectives from various sources across the internet.

Media Bias Tools

- Ad Fontes Media Interactive tool with filters that arrays media sources from "Most Extreme Left" to "Most Extreme Right" and from "Original Fact Reporting" and "More Reliable" to "Contains Inaccurate/Fabricated Information". Sources are rated by analysts assessing prominent articles from news sources.
- Media Bias Chart | AllSides Tool that rates only online content from Left to Center to Right by collecting information from people across the political spectrum.
- Al Generated the team created requests or "prompts" using Google's Al tool
 Gemini V2.0 Flash for a media bias rating assessment using left-leaning, rightleaning and center-leaning results for the Top 50 media sources, including
 mainstream news sources, alternative news sources and podcasts. The results
 were compiled in the linked chart.

If there is a particular news source that you use and would like us to help you analyze, please let us know. Our next step is to prepare an analysis of the news sources available for North Carolina news.
