

Survey weighted to match expected turnout demographics for the 2024 November Election. Margin of Error is +/-3.6% with a 95% level of confidence. Totals do not always equal 100% due to rounding. Survey conducted by Remington Research Group on behalf of Missouri Scout.

Not sure: 20%












