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

Survey conducted March 6 through March 8, 2024. 713 likely 2024 November Election voters participated in the survey. Survey weighted to match expected turnout demographics for the 2024 November Election. Margin of Error is +/-3.9% with a 95% level of confidence. Totals do not always equal 100% due to rounding. Survey conducted by Remington Research Group on behalf of Missouri Scout.

Josh Hawley: 53% Lucas Kunce: 39% Undecided: 8%


















