Volunteer Snapshot Sampling Event

On July 16th JRBP hosted our 4th Volunteer Snapshot Sampling Event. Within a four hour period, 35 volunteers collected samples at 65 sites across the James River Basin, including on the James River itself, various springs, Finley River, Crane Creek, Wilsons Creek, Pearson Creek and other tributaries. The snapshot approach "levels the playing field" with respect to flow conditions, which should be similar at all sites. This produces a "picture" of geographic differences in water quality over the basin that may be due to point or nonpoint sources of pollution.








Yard Ethic: Lawn Steward Soil Testing Program

JRBP staff stayed busy earlier this month conducting soil tests for the Lawn Steward program. Staff visited with landowners in the Wilsons Creek watershed to discuss soil health in their yards and collect soil samples. These samples are sent to be tested for pH, phosphorus, potassium, calcium, magnesium, and organic matter. JRBP staff interpret the results and create a 3-year nutrient management plan for the landowner. Springfield residents can participate free of charge. A limited number of appointments are available. 
