The original plan was to clean the Finley from Linden to Finley River Park, but low water forced a shift to the James. Recent Experiences in the James River Watershed



May 18th - JRBP Education Outreach Coordinator Brooke Widmar and Outdoor Initiative staff led participants on a morning paddle of Springfield Lake. Exploring the surrounding riparian area by kayak let us get a close look at birds along the lake, including great views of Prothonotary Warblers, a highlight of the morning.

June 21st – This was our 3rd year hosting 5th grade students from Nixa's John Thomas School of Discovery for a Water Wednesday field trip to learn about their local watershed. This field trip followed a few weeks of in-class lessons, covering topics such as the water cycle, macroinvertebrates, watersheds, point and non-point source pollution, and more. During the field trip students were able to observe the critters inhabiting a local creek and participate in other activities.

July 10th-14th – JRBP partnered with the Springfield Art Museum to host "The Great ARTdoors" a weeklong camp exploring nature and art for students. The campers were able to spend time outside birding, making observations in nature journals, painting with water from Fassnight Creek, and more.

July 22nd – Families were able to take part in JRBPs "Fishing the Finley" event in partnership with the Christian County Library. JRBP had fishing gear on hand thanks to Missouri Department of Conservation's Discover Nature-Fishing program, which participants were able to borrow to try fishing around Finley River Park in Ozark, MO.


