

Born in Poland, Konstancja began her violin studies at the age of 7. She graduated from Karol Szymanowski Music School in Katowice in 2015 in violin class of Adam Wagner. From September 2015, Konstancja continued her studies at Guildhall School of Music and Drama with Krzysztof Smietana. Currently, she is in her third year of undergraduate study at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, studying with Levon Chilingirian.

Konstancja participated in many workshops and masterclasses, during which she had a pleasure to work with distinguished violinists including Boris Kucharsky, Jennifer

Pike, Friedemann Eichhorn, Konstanty Andrzej Kulka, Bartłomiej Nizioł, Kaja Danczowska, Jakub Jakowicz and Rainer Honeck.



Konstancja is also a laureate of numerous prizes in many competitions, including 1st Prize on London Grand Prize Virtuoso Competition 2015, 2nd Prize on Paris Grand Prize Virtuoso Competition 2015, 3rd Prize on International 'Young Paganini' Violin Competition 2014.

As a soloist, she performed several times with Symphony Orchestra of Silesian Philharmonic. With the same Orchestra, she has recorded "Faust Fantasy" by Henryk Wieniawski as a part of 'Europa Ante Portas' project.

As an orchestra musician, Konstancja performed with many UK based and Polish ensembles, such as Guildhall Symphony

Orchestra, Melos Sinfonia, International Lutoslawski Youth Orchestra 2015, Aegis Orchestra and World Harmony Orchestra.

She had opportunity to perform in venues such as Barbican Concert Hall, Cadogan Hall, Milton Court Concert Hall, LSO St. Luke's, Witold Lutoslawski Concert Studio of Polish Radio in Warsaw and the concert hall of Polish National Radio Symphony Orchestra.

As a chamber musician, Konstancja performs with London Panufnik Trio. The trio is working permanently with distinguished professors- Jacqueline Ross, and Caroline Palmer. In addition, they participate in masterclasses with professors such as The Gould Trio, Ralph Gotoni, Levon Chilingirian, Krzysztof Smietana, Carole Presland, Matthew Jones, Tom Poster, Wolfgang Redik and members of Endellion Quartet.
