

#### **Key findings**


- The illegal drug types most frequently used by NZDTS respondents in the past 6 months were cannabis (70%), MDMA (45%), LSD/psychedelics (45%), cocaine (23%), and ketamine (19%)
- The proportion of respondents indicating lifetime use of cocaine increased from 37% in 2022/23 to 48% in 2024
- The highest rates of recent meth use were found in Manawatu-Wanganui, Waikato and Northland
- MDMA and ketamine use were highest in Otago, Wellington and Canterbury
- Rates of recent nicotine vaping surpassed tobacco smoking for the first time in 2024


#### Methods


The New Zealand Drug Trends Survey (NZDTS) is an anonymous online convenience survey designed to provide an annual snapshot of drug market trends in Aotearoa New Zealand. It surveys a very large number of people with recent experience and knowledge of drug use and drug markets across the country (i.e., key experts). The NZDTS is promoted via a targeted Meta advertising campaign over a period of several months. The 2024 survey was conducted from 20 February to 3 July and achieved a final sample of 10,781. While the NZDTS is not a representative sample, it broadly represents the demographic profile and regional population distribution of NZ. For more information on the survey visit our website.
