Following a 2002 Bishops Sustainability Conference, VUSA launched a part-time rugby programme for children from disadvantaged communities.

Fast forward to 2019 and this small rugby programme is now a formally registered NPO & PBO which provides holistic opportunities for children in the Langa community – currently over 450 children benefit annually by receiving academic support, sport coaching, recreational opportunities and a hot daily meal. The ultimate vision is to create a hub of excellence that supports children from creche to tertiary education.

Aligned with the Bishops policy framework for sustainable development, VUSA's core focus is the eradication of poverty.

Creating educational and recreational opportunities for the talented children in the Langa community and the inspiring coaches who work with them, is paramount in directing and shaping a South Africa that embodies Nelson Mandela's vision for a people centred society - "freedom from want, freedom from hunger, freedom from deprivation, freedom from ignorance, freedom from suppression and freedom from fear."

29 % of South Africans are unemployed and 55% live beneath the poverty line.



REGARD VUSA AS THEIR SAFE SPACE AFTER SCHOOL



A GLOBAL CRISIS

The Sustainable Development Goals are a collection of 17 global goals set by the United Nations General Assembly in 2015 for the year 2030.

South African education is in crisis - this perpetuates the ongoing cycle of poverty and inequality in our beautiful country.

VUSA tackles some of these issues by creating educational and recreational opportunities for children in the Langa community whilst employing (and upskilling) staff from the same community.

Although each goal is important to our global future, VUSA's focus is on development of **children**. Our primary goals are thus focus on development of children and our secondary focus is on addressing **inequality**.

SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

In order to focus our work to ensure maximum impact we have focussed on 5 Primary Sustainable Development Goals and 2 Secondary.

All 17 SDG's are critical and are considered in the VUSA methodology.



REDUCED INEQUALITIES

VUSA programmes

have all been developed to address and reduce social and economic challenges faced by our children and staff who have suffered inequalities that continue to plague South Africa.

GENDER EQUALITY

Young girls are the most vulnerable demographic in the Langa community – our programmes encourage participation of females. Through mentorship programmes with coaches, males are educated on the necessity of gender equality.

78 % of Grade 3 children in South Africa cannot read with understanding and on 33% of Grade 12 Learners passed Maths in 2018.

VUSA offers English and Maths support to primary school learners through Edunova. The new VUSA creche programme introduces young learners to literacy and numeracy skills preparing them for school readiness.

STAFF DEVELOPMENT

The VUSA academy employs ten wonderful men and women who teach, coach, feed and mentor the children. The importance of this role is not lost on our staff and as such eight VUSA coaches have enrolled in the Wordworks 'Ready, Steady, Read programme in partnership with Siykhula.

Coaches reported that the course not only gave them tools to assist with early literacy but gave them a better understanding of the emotional circumstances of the children they work with.

Coaches also attend the following courses:

• Boksmart – A national rugby safety programme focusing on medical protocols and concussion• WR level 1 - The objective of this course is to provide all rugby Coaches and Officials with the opportunity to develop and obtain acknowledgement and training so that they may realise their potential to the maximum• Cool Play – Coaches receive training to teach life skills to children through sport• Wordworks - Every Word Counts certificate

VUSA ON TOUR 2019

2019 marked what was a life changing experience for 45 of our VUSA Boys and Girls.

On the 23rd of September, a bus packed with 45 excited children and igwijo (African songs that take the form of a leader and a crowd response) left for Qoboquobo in the Eastern Cape.

After a 15 hour trip filled with laughter, food and snacks (thanks to our wonderful partners Shoprite) the team arrived in Qoboquobo where we competed in a Heritage Day festival against 11 teams from the local village.

In true Eastern Cape style, we were invited into the hosts homes and welcomed with umgqusho for dinner (samp and meat) – a definite highlight for me and a reminder that I was 'home' again.

The following day, after a much-needed rest and a wonderful breakfast it was time to show Qoboquobo what we were made of - the children did us proud! The VUSA squad reached the final of the tournament, losing the last game 15-12.

Thereafter, the kids had the opportunity to explore the village, seeing animals and playing touch rugby with children from the community.

We then headed to PE and had the privilege of playing against Springbok Captain, Siya Kilisi's youth Club, the African Bombers.

A tour would not be a tour without experiencing new places and the last afternoon was spent on one of PE's beautiful beaches.

This trip was an incredible experience for the children and the coaches. Lifelong friendships were formed and great relationships were built between the kids and their coaches.

I would like to thank everyone, especially Steve Bailey who made this trip possible, and massive thank you to our VUSA COACHES for looking after our kids safely.

Creche Programme

In 2020 we hope to extend the creche programme. Early intervention is key. VUSA would like to create a mobile library and education centre which will travel between our four ECD facilities daily.
