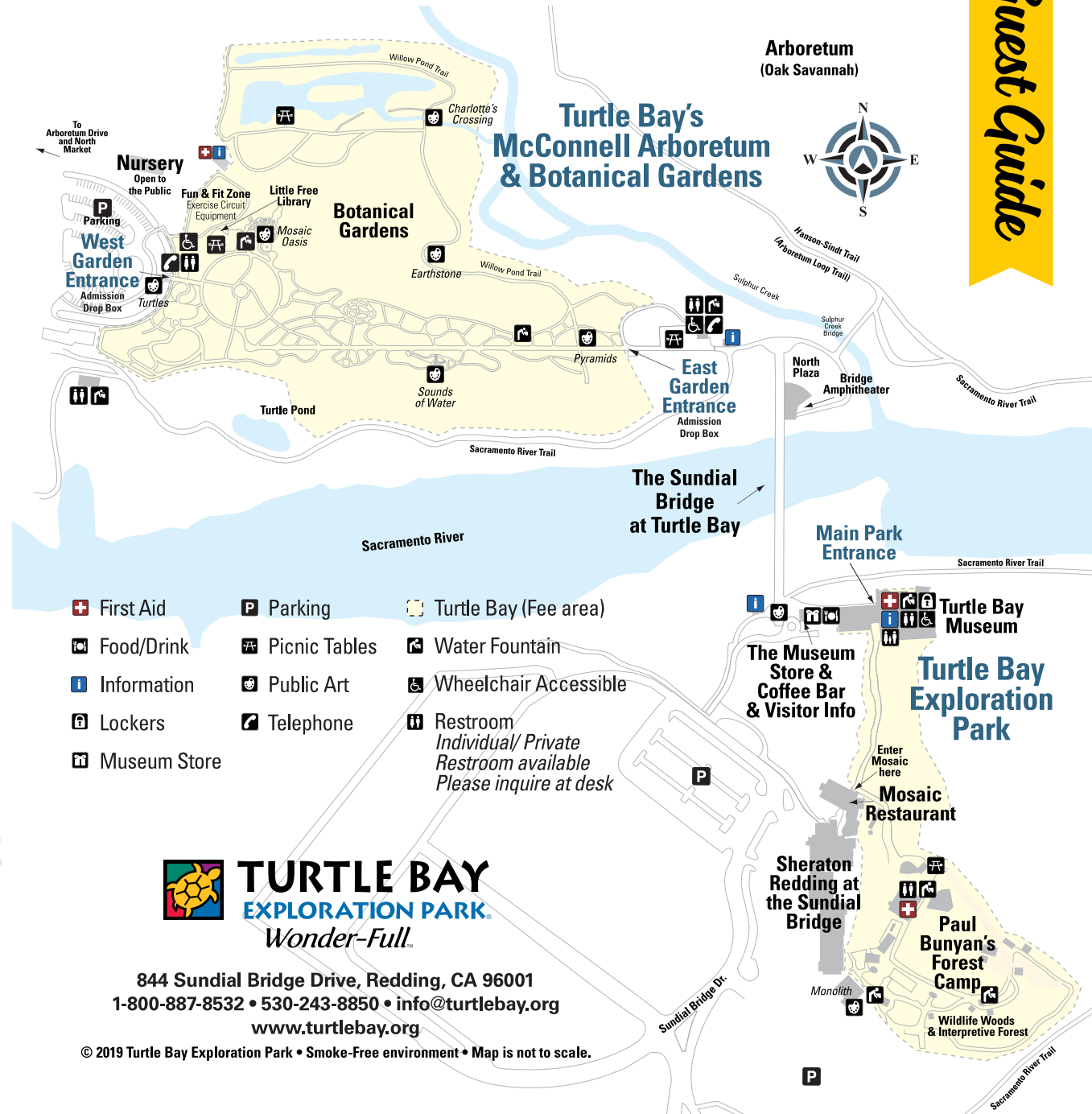

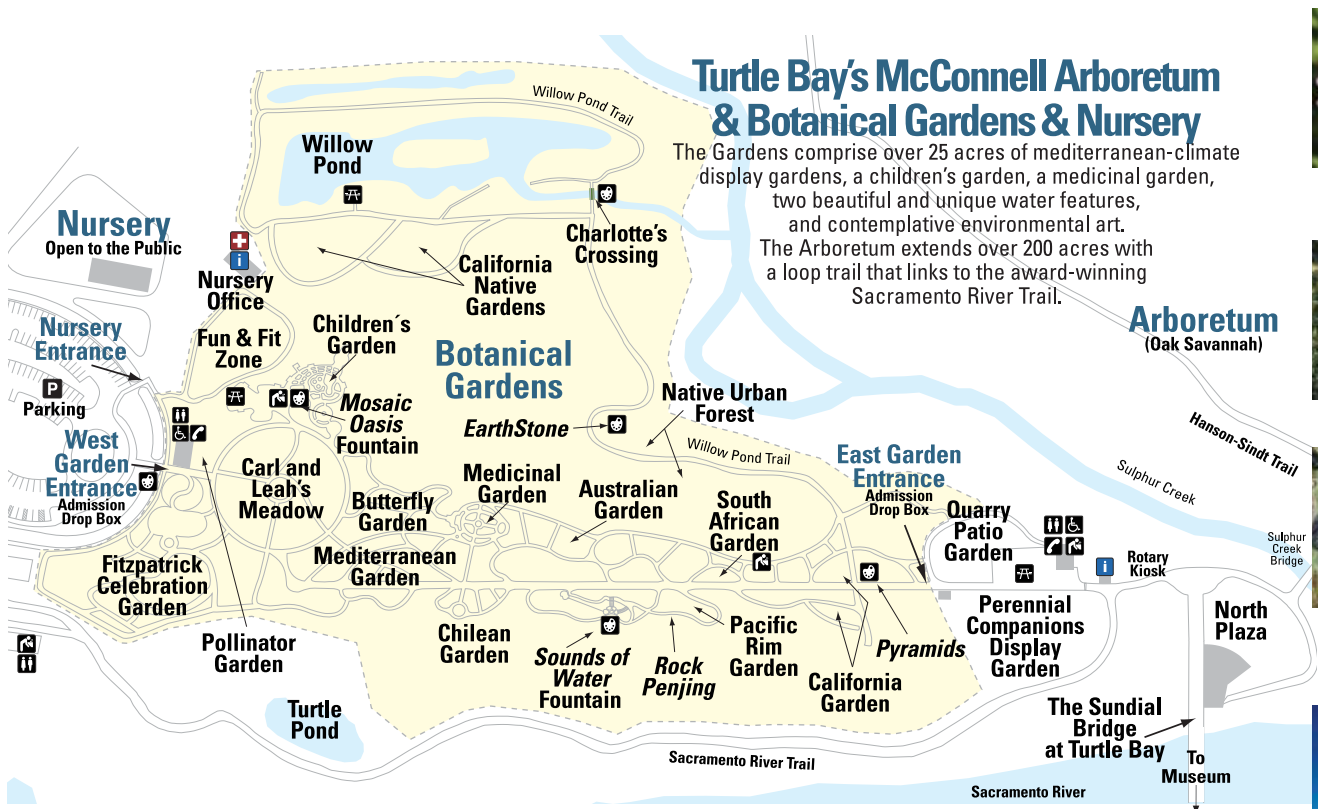

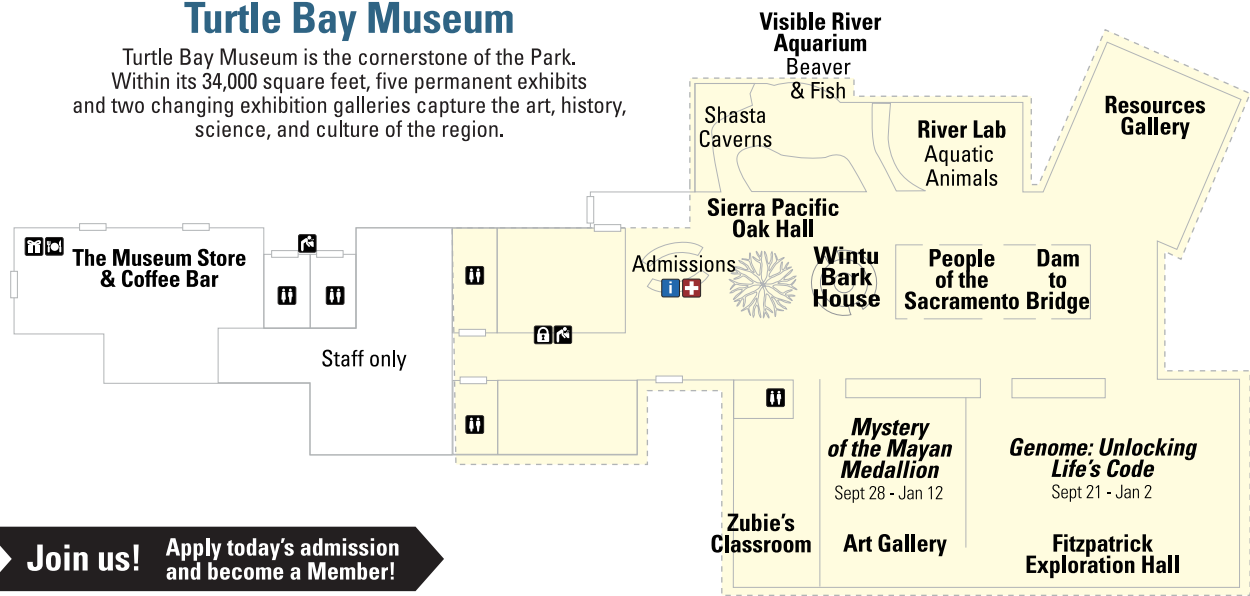


Turtle Bay's McConnell Arboretum & Botanical Gardens & Nursery

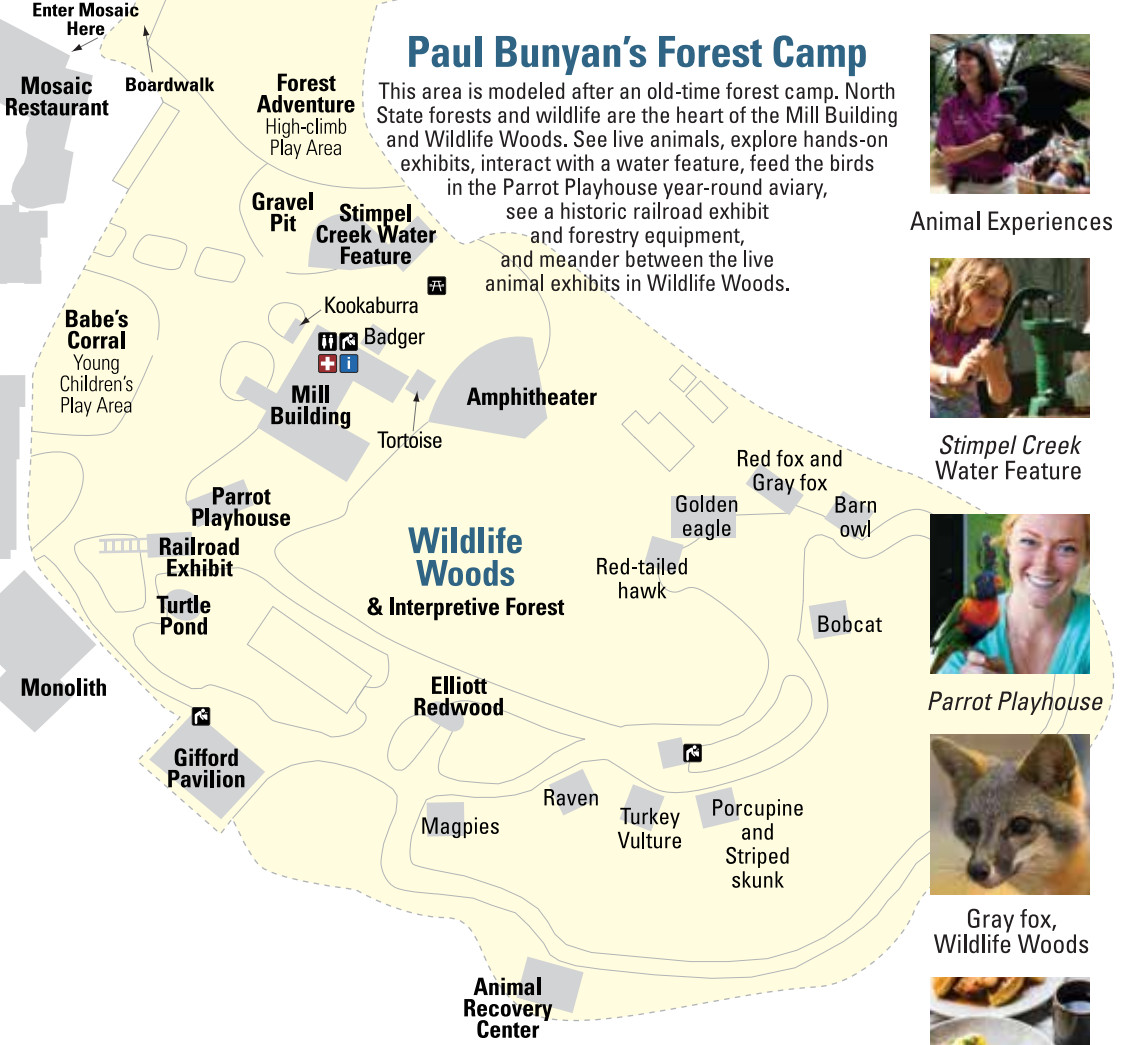

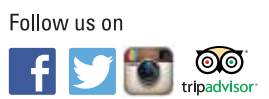
