STRATEGIC PRIORITIES, GOALS, AND STRATEGIES

Strategic Priority A

Educate community leaders and raise awareness about and compassion toward vulnerable community members.



GOAL:

Increase (by at least 20%) the number of community leaders and residents that understand the needs of vulnerable community members and act with compassion toward them.

Strategic Priority B

Expand our facilities to integrate existing programs and add new programs.



GOAL:

Extend our reach in the community to increase the people and/or households we serve by 25%.

Strategic Priority C

Expand existing services and offer new services for the people we serve in response to unmet or emerging needs.



GOAL 1:

Develop at least 3 new programs to meet community needs for services that are not already provided by PRC or our network.

GOAL 2:

Provide a safe place where the people we serve can explore all their viable options to promote their resilience and well-being.

Strategic Priority D

Strengthen our networks, including with local government, other community service organizations, community leaders, donors, and corporations.



GOAL 1:

Establish or expand at least 3 programmatic partnerships with local government, nonprofits, and/or community leaders.

GOAL 2:

Achieve a 20% increase in non-government funding, including from donors and corporations, which will diversify our funding portfolio.



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Vision

Every person in our community lives with dignity and has the opportunity to thrive.

Mission

To support the resilience and well-being of families and individuals in Pacifica and along the coast.

Our Programs

We accomplish our mission with services that include providing groceries onsite or by delivery to help our community feed their families; emergency financial assistance for past due rent, mortgage, deposit, and utilities to prevent homelessness; financial education and coaching, tax preparation, and matched savings programs to help increase families' economic security; and problem solving with families and individuals to find solutions and opportunities that work for them, including information and referrals. PRC also responds to emerging community needs, which led PRC to establish our Unhoused on the Coast outreach work and implement the Pacifica Safe Parking Permit program on behalf of the City of Pacifica to help unhoused individuals and families return to housing.
