

In my travels to both the Michigan and Indiana State Conventions I am able to meet some unbelievable individuals and hear their stories of strength and using their "VOICE" to make change. It makes you realize that we need to continue to IMPACT LIVES AND MAKE A DIFFERENCE EVERY DAY!

Kyle Bailey visited us in Michigan to spread the word of Organ Donorship. He is one of only 70 people in the world with (4) organ transplants. He has both lungs, a liver, and a kidney. Instead of using it as an excuse he pushes forward working 40 hours a week as a golf pro and also bicycling across the State of Michigan. His goal is to change the State into an Opt out of Organ donorship instead of an Opt in when people renew their driver's license. When he began his challenge the State was at 32% donors, with today it reaching almost 63% with his efforts. The State has assured him that if he reaches 75% the will become an Opt out State. This August he will bike from Mackinaw City to Port Huron Bride to continue his goal and signup Organ donors along the way!

I think we all remember the amazing story of Tyler Trent, the passionate Purdue Boilermaker fan who courageously fought bone cancer this past NCAA football season. Even in the midst of this horrible disease he continued to spread his message and show support for his favorite team. On Saturday morning during the Indiana convention his parents Tony and Kelly shared the emotional journey they went through as a family. The room was captivated as he explained the need for further research and support in the field of Cancer. He urged all of us to continue to use our Voice's, as Tyler's has been silenced with his passing. They have written a book based on Tyler's fight and life, with all proceeds helping childhood cancer research!
