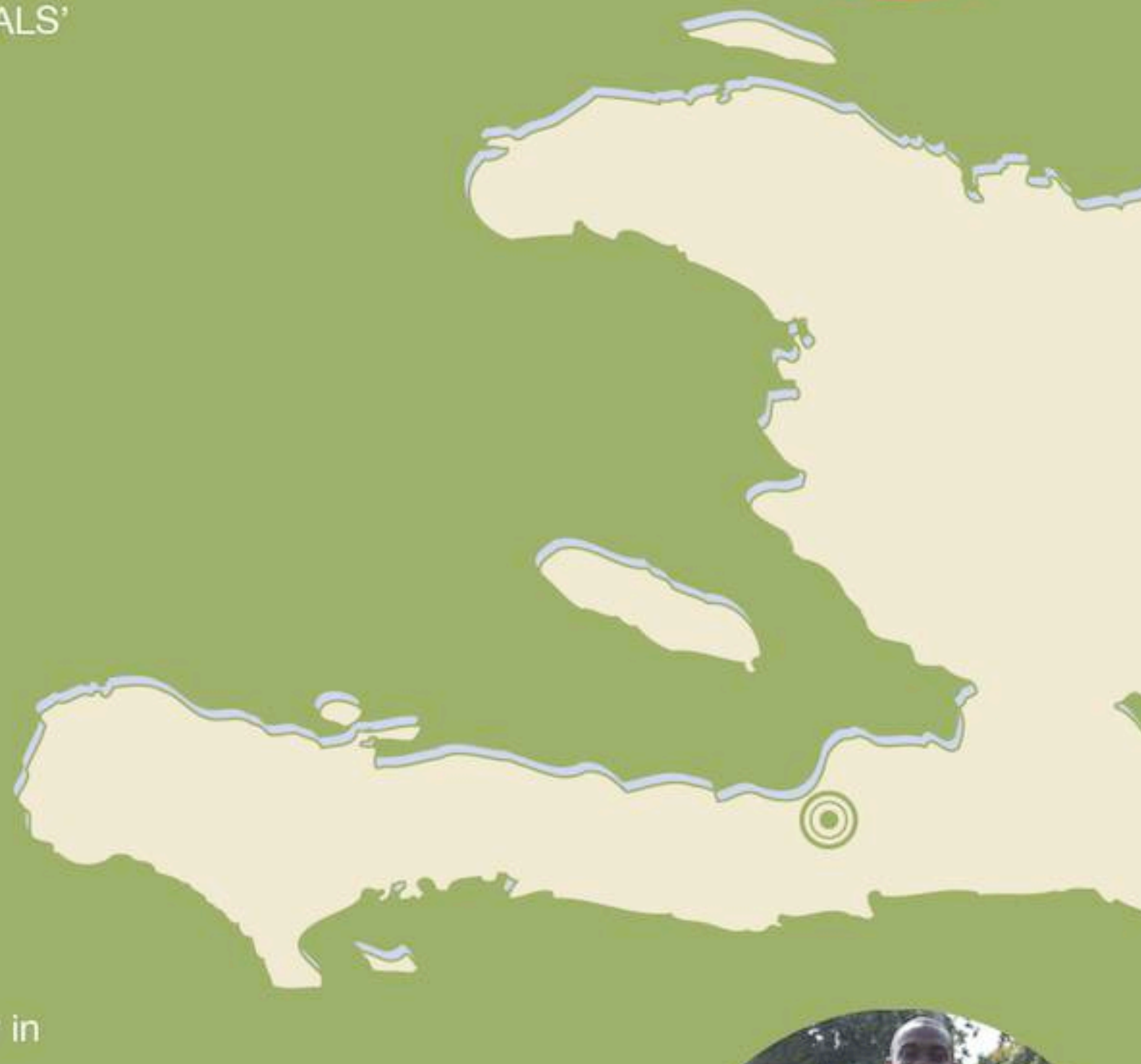


GOALS uses soccer in Haiti to engage youth and their families in health, education, and development programs which improve quality of life today and develop new leaders for tomorrow.

Our impact

Health Education and Outreach

GOALS' ongoing health education outreach focuses on knowledge vital to the local Haitian setting: hand washing, nutrition, food hygiene and mosquito-borne illnesses.

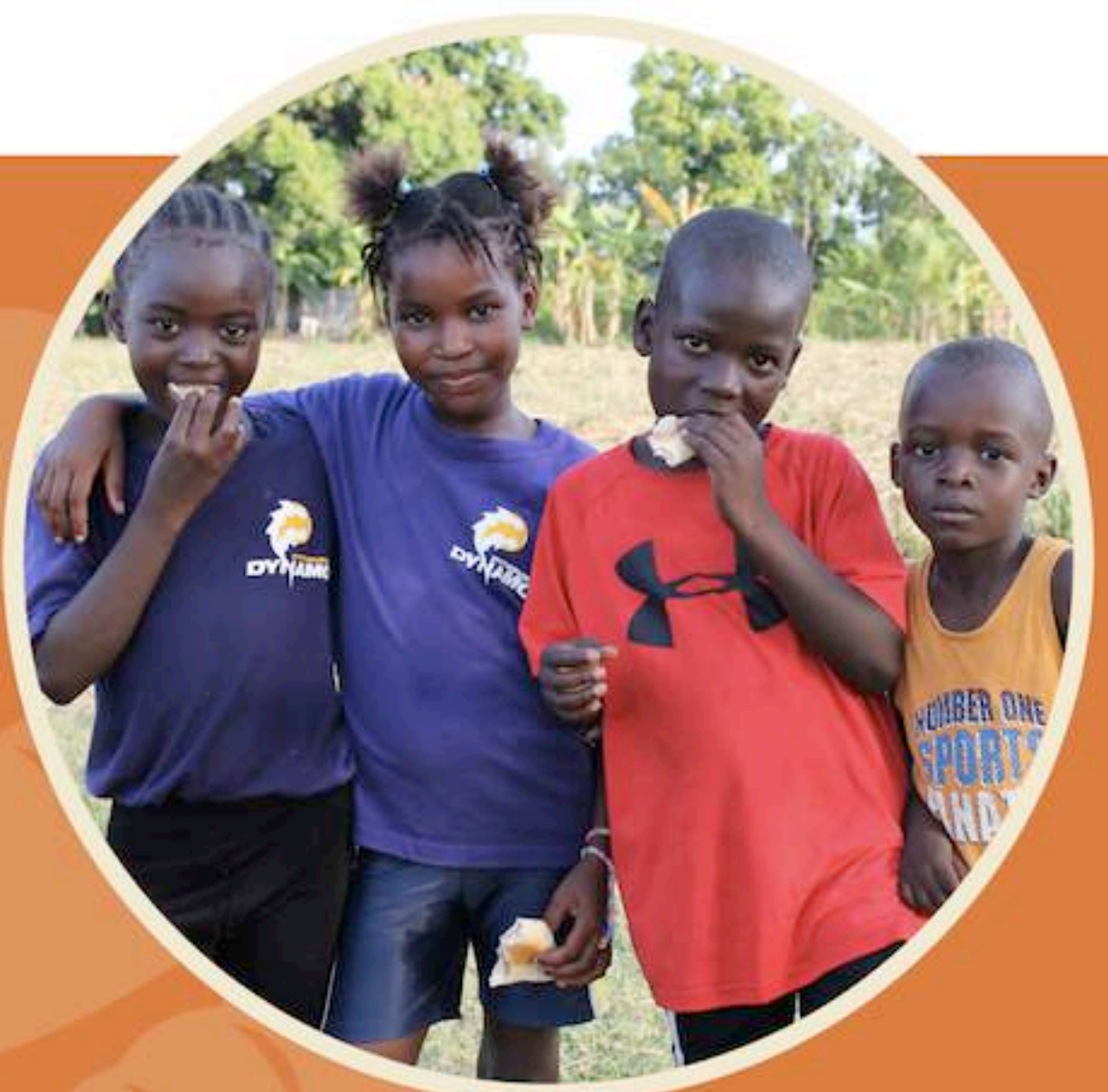

NEW The GOALS Bread Bakery

The new GOALS bread bakery created 4 new jobs, allowing GOALS to feed even more children at a reduced cost, and providing an income for 10 GOALS parents who buy in bulk and resell for a profit.



Literacy

23 out of 23 students enrolled in GOALS' first literacy class improved their reading and writing skills, and 50% of students scored high enough to be considered fully literate on their final assessment. Our second literacy class has enrolled 32 children and adult learners.

Youth leadership and service

This year, GOALS kids repaired footbridges and patched roadways, led activities for younger kids, visited a recycling center, planted four new community gardens, cleaned and painted public water pumps, and built fences from recycled materials.

Soccer and Gender Equality

After adding two mixed-gender kids teams in 2014, GOALS will add our first ever little girls team (ages 8-14) in 2015.

The Haitian Football Federation selected GOALS coach Walker Rosemond to attend a one-week intensive coach training seminar with FIFA in Port au Prince.

GOALS adopts Coaches Across Continents' new on-field curriculum to reduce gender-based violence by teaching youth to "ASK for choice!"

Staff and leadership

GOALS' Coach Nadege Exilhomme was named "Young Leader of the Year" by the Haitian YWCA.

Program Manager Jean Kendy Estimphil represented Haiti at the street football world Future Goals Youth Leader Forum in Brazil during the World Cup.

GOALS welcomed two new board members, Toby Simon and Scott Jackson, while saying goodbye to founding board president Paul Sorensen.

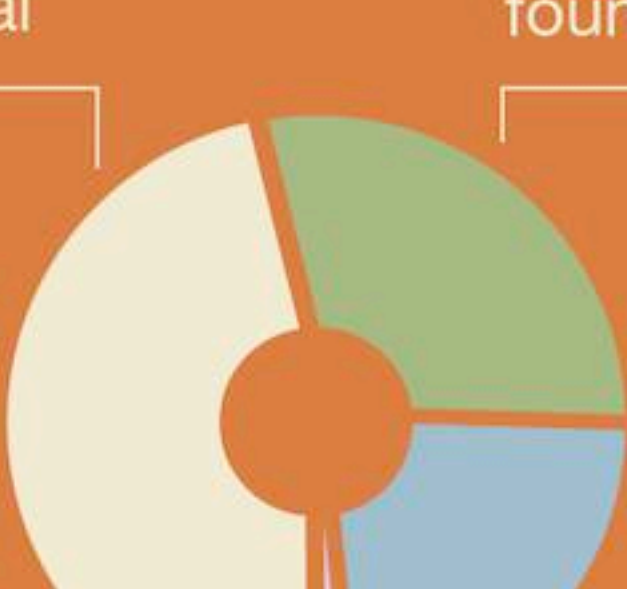
