LEVY PROJECTS, NEW ELEMENTARY ON SCHEDULE

Olentanav Schools appreciates the community's support last spring in the passage of the levy to fund necessary school improvements and respond to district growth.

Director of Business Management and Facilities Jeff Gordon recently provided an update on the District's bond commitments, and plans to complete the permanent improvement projects.

In the summer of 2021, the following projects will be completed:

- 15 elementary schools will receive playground updates.
- 16 security vestibules will be constructed within schools.
- A bus lane will be added to Hyatts Middle and Liberty Tree Elementary schools.
- Hyatts Middle School will undergo a parking lot expansion at the stadium.
- · Classrooms will be modified into broadcast journalism suites at Berlin High School, Olentangy



Construction of Shale Meadows Elementary School is well underway. The school is among projects being funded by passage of the March 2020 levy.

High School and Liberty High School.

All Olentangy elementary school playgrounds will have the main structure replaced with a handicap accessible structure, and soft play surfaces will update the existing gravel.

Because of this construction, Olentangy elementary playgrounds will be closed during the upcoming summer of 2021.

The levy funds the building and operation of Middle School 6 and

Elementary Schools 16 and 17. Middle School 6 will be located north of Cheshire Elementary, along Glenmead Drive between Gregory Road and Piatt Road, and will be joined with Berlin High School. Construction of Middle School 6 will begin in June of 2021. Elementary School 16, Shale Meadows Elementary, is located in the future Berlin Meadows community off Peachblow Road in Delaware.

The school's layout

largely resembles the floorplan of Olentangy's other elementaryschools, with six additional classroom spaces. New attendance boundaries were announced in March, and Shale Meadows Elementary will open for students for the 2021-2022 school year.

A few items funded by the 2020 levy will be completed in the summer of 2022, including the parking expansion at the west transportation center.

The creation of an Olentangy Alumni Association has been many years in the making.

When many of you attended Olentangy, it was just a one-building school district. Or maybe it had grown to a one or two high school district. At that time, there wasn't a need for a formalized association to unite our graduates. Olentangy was a close-knit community that stayed connected without the involvement of the school system.

Fast forward to today and we have coined the phrase "One Olentangy" to maintain that small community feel, while our district has expanded to four high schools that send nearly 2,000 graduates out into the world each May.

DISTRICT ENTERS NEXT STAGE OF BRANDING PROJECT

Olentangy Schools has been engaged in work for the past two years to meet our strategic plan goal of establishing a brand identity, accompanied by a licensing program.

In April 2019, Olentangy's district-wide brand was launched and work on phase two, developing our

building brand identities, began shortly after. Our elementary schools and preschool revealed their new brand identities in August 2020.

Throughout the second half of 2020, our five middle school brand project teams worked virtually on their brand development, and kicked off the

second semester with the launch of their new mascots and marks.

Moving forward, each high school has also formed brand project teams and has begun the process to update their brand identities with an expected roll-out in Spring

The building level brand

project teams have spent considerable time discussing what it means to be a member of their community, and the images, symbols and words that describe their school and how best to represent all members of their school community.

ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT: FROM BROADWAY TO ENTREPRENEUR

Meet Beth Johnson Nicely — a 2002 Olentangy graduate, former Rockette and Broadway performer turned virtual fitness instructor who has thrived over the past year through her company, The Limit.

What Olentangy schools did you attend?

I went to the original K -8 school, was redistricted to Wyandot Run Elementary when it opened, and then on to Olentangy Middle and High School.

What school experiences contributed to you choosing to go into musical theater?

I loved being in choir and show choir! Fun fact, I was in the high school production of Bye Bye Birdie when I was in middle school, but never did any musicals in high school because I was a cheerleader. But both cheerleading and choir

have helped me in my musical theatre career.

What did you do after leaving Olentangy that led you to where you are now?

I went to New York City when I was 17 years old to audition for the Rockettes. I ended up in an audition for a Broadway show by chance, and after making it through every

round, was later cast in the National Tour of 42nd Street as an understudy for the lead, Peggy Sawyer. After that show, I became a Rockette at Radio City Music Hall for two seasons. I then received an invitation to audition for my first Broadway show, Spamalot. I've performed in five Broadway shows since: Young

Frankenstein, White Christmas, Bullets Over Broadway, Something Rotten! (my Broadway lead debut), and Chicago. I have also worked as a fitness trainer for 10 years, and was part of the choreography team for Netflix's The Prom.

What inspired your transition from Broadway to virtual fitness business?

With my experience as a fitness trainer, and Broadway shut down during the pandemic, my private training sessions and classes remained busy — so I founded The Limit, my own fitness business. To go from a live career surrounded by people to a virtual format is different, but I enjoy challenges and it's amazing to teach people from all over the world.

Tell us about the Limit and how it works.

The Limit has challenging workouts through live zoom classes and workouts on demand, inspired by my experience as a performer. Clients go to TheLimitFit.com and sign up for a live Zoom class, or subscribe to us on demand and can work out anytime, anywhere, from any device. When performing
