

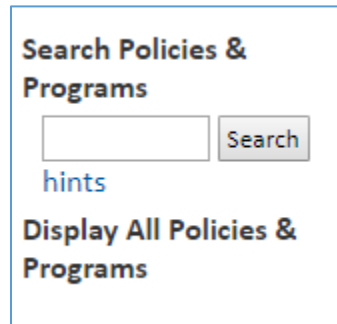

Display All Policies & Programs

- If users want to **search by health factor and evidence rating**, click on “Search Policies & Programs” to see a menu for refining the search.
- If users have a **specific strategy** in mind, conduct a Keyword search using the search box. If using multiple key words that need to be together in a specific order, such as “low birthweight,” use double quotes. *The “hints” link below it will provide several additional suggestions on refining the search if needed.*
- If users want to **browse all available programs**, click on “Display All Policies & Programs” to see a full listing of current WWFH strategies.

Users can also click on specific health factors within the County Health Rankings Model further down on the landing page to see strategies within them.

Once any of the above searches have been conducted, the results can be sorted by clicking on the column headings. **Evidence Rating** sorts by strength of evidence, with Scientifically Supported strategies displayed first, followed by Some Evidence, Expert Opinion, Insufficient Evidence, Mixed Evidence, and Evidence of Ineffectiveness.

Other sorting tips:

- Health Factor, Approach, and Policy or Programs each sort in alphabetical order.
- Clicking in the same heading a second time will sort in reverse.
- Clicking on the various decision makers field headings (further to the right) will sort by that decision maker. You may need to click twice to bring the icons up to the top of this column.
