You will learn to...



Reading 40-60 months

- Hears and says the initial sound in words.
- Can segment the sounds in simple words and blend them together and knows which letters represent some of them.
- Links sounds to letters, naming and sounding the letters of the alphabet.

Reading 30-50 months

Shows awareness of rhyme and alliteration.







Phonics Activity



RWI Phonics Set 1 Speed Sounds

Join in with the Set 1 Speed Sounds session every morning at 9.30am.

Today's sound of the day is m.

It is a **stretchy** sound - mmmmmmm.

Can you think of any words that begin with m?
E.g. mouse, mountain, mirror, moon









Phonics Activity

Fred Talk



Read the following green words to your child using Fred Talk (saying the sounds). Your child should blend the sounds to tell you the word. E.g. adult - "c a t", child - "cat"

map mum mop mat man

This time it is your child's turn to do the Fred Talk! Give them one of the words and ask them to Fred Talk the word (tell you the sounds). It is important that children can do this orally before they begin to read and write the sounds. E.g. adult - "cat", child - "c a t"

Encourage your child to count the sounds on their fingers as they go and then repeat it back to them also counting each sound on one finger. Ask questions such as 'how many sounds were in that word?' and 'what was the initial sound (the first sound) of that word?'

Phonics for parents How to say the sounds

Stretchy/bouncy sounds We use these terms when talking about how to say the sounds. Stretchy sounds are long sounds, e.g. sssssss or mmmm. Bouncy sounds are shorter, e.g. b b b or c c c.

Fred Talk We use the term Fred Talk to mean reading (blending) the sounds in a word to read that word. So cat is c-a-t. Use your fingers to count the sounds as you go.

Green Words are words that can be read by using Fred Talk.

Red Words are words that cannot be sounded out and need to be learnt by sight.

MATHS







You will learn to...



Number 40-60 months

- Recognises numerals 1 to 5.
- Counts up to three or four objects by saying one number name for each item.
- Counts actions or objects which cannot be moved.
- Counts objects to 10, and beginning to count beyond 10.
- Counts out up to six objects from a larger group.

Number 30-50 months

- Recites numbers in order to 10.
- Knows that numbers identify how many objects are in a set.
- Beginning to represent numbers using fingers, marks on paper or pictures.
- Sometimes matches numeral and quantity correctly.









Every day...



- Practise counting to 20 (and beyond!)
- Practise counting backwards from 10
- Practise recognising different 2D (flat) and 3D (solid) shapes and numbers














★★ Can you accurately count the superheroes below? Can you write the correct number for each one? Count carefully - this includes numbers to 20!










★★★ Can you find the missing numbers? Write them in your home learning book.

Encourage your child to count one object at a time to ensure they are counting accurately. They can use their finger to help them.

If they are finding it difficult, give them the same number of objects to count. This could be anything, e.g. coins, pasta etc.
