

Pastels by Mallory Lake

allory Lake's pastel paintings of lush Italian villas and sweeping landscapes captivate like magic: her pastels flourish with breathtaking details of the real and the imagined, and we believe in the awe-inspiring world she presents. In her idyllic paintings, Mallory not only evokes the true beauty of the scenery before us, but she also enchants us with light and composition to suggest wonders beyond what is visible.

A frequent feature within Mallory's pastels are objects partially hidden by trees, shadows, long distances, or close perspectives, and these objects are rendered in such a way as to suggest their own longing to be revealed. For instance, Moresco (LK748) and Summer Afternoon, Lake Como (LK732) each contain an elegant building surrounded almost entirely on the left and below by dark trees and bushes. So much thick vegetation allows for only a glimpse of the exposed facade, but this exposure draws the viewer's eye from the dense brush into the open air. Here the building seems to extend itself ardently toward the sunlit sky (Moresco) and the delicate waters (Summer Afternoon, Lake Como). Following Mallory's cues, we are initially intrigued by the dark branches and the mysterious buildings before she draws us to the bright space.

Even expansive landscapes such as **S. Ambrogio**, **Tuscany** (LK443), **Storm Clouds**, **Colombare** (LK646), **Aliano** (LK734), and **Sunrise**, **San Ambogio** (LK740) show buildings obstructed by foliage or shrouded in shadow, yet again the eye is lifted outward and upward toward the soft, hazy lines of the sun-lit horizon. Furthermore, in **Villa Cipressi** (LK673) and **Twilight, Villa Cipressi** (LK527), Mallory proves that a single location has the potential to express vastly different moods when perspective is modified. In the blue-green **Twilight, Villa Cipressi**, the extremely narrow canvas mimics the tall, dense trees that climb high toward the skies, blocking the lake and distant hills almost entirely from view. A feeling of melancholy emanates from the structure in the distance, which remains a mysterious unknown. Conversely, **Villa Cipressi** bursts in golden light as the front exterior of the hotel fills the whole surface, eliciting awe toward the structure's grandeur and curiosity on its whereabouts.

The alluring qualities of Mallory Lake's pastel paintings emerge vis-à-vis her perspective on real locations. As renderings from photographs of her travels: actual villas, communes, cafes, and streets, Mallory's paintings are true to life but even more so in that they enhance the interactions between architecture, light, and vegetation imbuing a sense of quiet, hopeful yearning. This longing is often captured through a subdued tension within a beautiful scene in which Mallory shows as much care in restraint as she does in amplifying details. She withholds information within a scene to reveal something much more—a deeper sense of connection to the world as Mallory sees it. Each work of art then deepens our understanding of a given place as it exists through her lens, and in doing so provokes in us an ache for the world as it appears in her work.




