

South Saskatchewan Access Pipeline

Proposed Project:

Steel Reef is proposing to construct a pipeline known as the "South Saskatchewan Access Pipeline" to transport natural gas produced near the town of Portal, ND to an existing gas processing facility owned and operated by Steel Reef near the community of North Portal, SK. In addition to the new pipeline, the proposed project will include the construction of associated infrastructure including pipeline pig traps, emergency shutdown valves and metering facilities at the North Portal Gas Plant.

Project Information:

- Capacity: 900,000 cubic meters per day (32MMscf/d) of natural gas gathered from existing oil wells in the Burke County region of North Dakota.
- Product: The solution gas will contain up to 3% hydrogen sulphide (H₂S) i.e., "sour" gas.
- Length: approximately 7 kilometers (4.35 miles).
- Size: outside diameter of 273.1 millimeters (10.75").

Project Schedule:

Regulatory submissions are anticipated by Q4 2017 to target a construction start in Q3 2018. Construction of the proposed project is subject to receipt of all required regulatory approvals. In the US, an application for a Presidential Permit and Natural Gas Action Section 3 Authorization will be required via submission to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC). In Canada, the proposed project will be regulated federally by the National Energy Board (NEB) and will require an Order under Section 58 of the NEB Act.

Upstream oil production facilities will remain under the authority of the North Dakota Industrial Commission. Similarly, Steel Reef's existing North Portal Gas Plant will remain under the jurisdiction of the Saskatchewan Ministry of Economy.

Steel Reef is committed to adhere to all applicable consultation and design requirements for state and provincial regulatory bodies.
