Lynnette has 20 years experience in research and evaluation, particularly in health and human services.

Throughout her career she has focused on relationship-building with customers and key stakeholders—consumers, partners, funders and other interested parties—to increase clarity and common understanding of the issue(s) addressed and the solution(s) created.

Under her leadership, Thoughtwell (previously CRP) has transformed into a self-supporting community resource, with 91% of its \$1.1M in annual revenue earned from fee-for-service projects and 96% of projects completed on time and on budget. During 2016, 100% of clients surveyed rated their satisfaction with Thoughtwell’s expertise and professionalism as “excellent” or “good” and that project goals deadlines were “completely” met.

Some of her accomplishments to date include facilitating a statewide Planning Council charged with completing Ohio's first Public Health assessment (SHA) which led to a request for her to lead the council in developing Ohio's first Public Health Improvement plan (SHIP), leading the first-ever regional census of the gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender community in central Ohio, convening United Way of Central Ohio service providers in education, health, workforce, and neighborhood development to identify common outcomes across content area, and chairing the only federally recognized institutional Review Board at a state agency in Ohio.
