



NATIONAL DESERT STORM WAR MEMORIAL LEGISLATION PASSES THROUGH U.S. CONGRESS

Washington, DC, December 15, 2014 – The U.S. Senate joins the U.S. House of Representatives in passing the legislation authorizing a National Desert Storm and Desert Shield Veteran’s Memorial in Washington D.C.



After more than two years of effort the Memorial has cleared the two major legislative hurdles, with legislation passed by both the House and Senate.

The language authorizing the Memorial was included in the 2014 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA).

Next, the Bill goes to President Obama for signature. The NDSWMA is optimistic that this will happen by the end of the year.

“This legislation only authorizes us to work with the National Park Service to select a site, and allows us to erect the memorial on the selected site,” said Scott Stump, CEO of NDSWMA. All costs must be paid for by fundraising activities, so our attention will now be focused on that critical task. We want to express our gratitude to Representative Dr. Phil Roe, Senator Joe Donnelly and Senator John Boozman for sponsoring our legislation in Congress.”
