SARAH TREEM (Playwright) is the only writer to have written and produced all three seasons of the acclaimed HBO series, In Treatment, for which she won a WGA award and was nominated for a Humanitas award. She is also a writer/producer for the Mark Wahlberg/Stephen Levinson produced HBO series How to Make it in America and is currently adapting Samantha Peale's novel The American Painter Emma Dial for HBO with Philip Seymour Hoffman and Emily Ziff. Sarah participated in the 11th annual Tel Aviv-Los Angeles Film and TV Master Class in Israel in July 2009 and in a conference titled "How They Did It: Turning an Israeli Series into HBO's In Treatment" for New York Women in Film & Television in March 2010. Her full-length plays include Empty Sky; Against the Wall; Mirror, Mirror; A Feminine Ending; and Human Voices. A Feminine Ending received its world premiere at Playwrights Horizons in fall 2007, was subsequently produced at South Coast Repertory and Portland Center Stage in 2008, and is published by Samuel French, which has also published *Mirror, Mirror*. *Human Voices* was part of Manhattan Theater Club's Spring Boards New Play Series and New York Stage and Film's Powerhouse Reading Season in 2007. Sarah has been in residence at the Sundance Institute, The Ojai Playwriting Conference, The Screenwriters Colony, and will soon be in residence at the Yaddo Artists' Colony. She has been commissioned by South Coast Repertory and Playwrights Horizons, and she is a current fellow at the Lark Playwrights' Workshop. Sarah has taught playwriting at Yale University, where she earned her B.A. and M.F.A.

LUCY GRAM (Director, Producer) is a freelance theatre director and the Founding Director/Producer of One Bird Productions. Local directing credits include Obehi Janice's Black Girl Yoga (Bostonia Bohemia) as well as readings of Meron Langsner's Legacies (Open Theatre Project) and Mike Poe's Like Father (One Bird). She has also directed Allison Eve Zell's Come to Leave at the Kitchen Theatre Company's Kitchen Sink, and has assisted for Sleeping Weazel, the Dallas Theater Center, and the Kitchen Theatre Company. In her spare time she is a fine art and event photographer whose work can be found on lucygramphotography.com. She is an LA native and a proud graduate of Ithaca College.
