

We are looking for an enthusiastic individual to join our Education Team and assist with our schools programme, <u>Hebridean Marine Explorers</u>. This is an exciting opportunity to develop and deliver memorable and inspiring environmental education, helping empower children to care for the marine environment and take positive action to protect it.

WHAT YOU WILL BE DOING

- Teaching children and delivering HWDT's schools programme in classrooms, outdoors and on our research yacht Silurian, alongside our Education Manager.
- Assisting with the preparation of school visits to ensure we provide a quality service.
- Monitoring and keeping records during and after sessions, i.e. pupil numbers, teacher feedback and photographic consent to help support evaluation.
- Taking photographs and writing news items for our website to publicise and promote our education programme to an external audience.

You will also have your own development project to work on:

- Creating a new and inspiring workshop for primary schools to raise awareness of the pressures that whales and dolphins face.
- Developing new resources for the workshop to encourage learning through doing.
- Piloting your new workshop in schools and evaluating the success of this to identify opportunities for future development.


WHAT YOU WILL GET FROM THE PLACEMENT

SKILLS, EXPERIENCE AND ATTIBUTES YOU NEED

- Friendly with a confident communication style
- Passion to inspire and educate people of all ages

- Ability to live and work with colleagues as part of a small team

- Experience delivering activities to children and young people
- Knowledge of Scottish cetaceans and their related conservation issues

WHAT YOU CAN EXPECT FROM US

- Training and ongoing support, including an initial induction, regular one-to-one meetings and post-placement advice.
- Commitment to support your professional development and flexibility to tailor the placement to you specifically where possible.
- Reimbursement for reasonable travel and subsistence expenses linked to the project (this does not include travel to/from Mull at the start and end of the placement).
- Support to identify accommodation options for the placement volunteers typically rent a room in a shared house, which costs them roughly £90 per week (including bills).
- Understanding that you may want to investigate avenues for external employment during your placement, in order to support yourself whilst volunteering. Where possible, we aim to be flexible, to help you secure part-time employment locally, which complements the placement. (Seasonal jobs in bars, restaurants and shops are often available in Tobermory.)
- × Please note that unfortunately **WE WILL NOT PROVIDE** accommodation or contribute towards your living expenses.

Unfortunately we are unable to be flexible with the start date, due to essential training.


TIME COMMITMENT

22 .5HR PER WEEK ON AVERAGE, FLEXIBLE

This role will involve some evenings and occasional weekends. Due to the delivery schedule of the project, hours spent volunteering will fluctuate from week to week, and the placement will include approximately four week-long trips away from Tobermory.

LIFE ON THE ISLE OF MULL

Tobermory is the largest town on the Isle of Mull in the Hebrides. Mull is a remote island and only accessible by ferry links from the Scottish mainland. It is surrounded by beautiful natural landscapes, vast skies and a variety of wildlife. The waters around our island are frequently visited by minke whales, bottlenose dolphins, harbour porpoises and a wide range of marine life.

Tobermory has a good range of facilities including a co-op, pharmacy, doctor's surgery, dentist, pubs, gift shops, and cafes. There are also small music venues and a theatre. More amenities such as high street chains, supermarkets, train station etc. can be found in Oban; a 40-minute drive plus a 45-minute ferry journey away.

A diverse range of activities are available during the season such as sports, fitness clubs, dance classes, craft workshops, music and book festivals and a car rally. There is also our only Munro, Ben More, to climb and outlying islands such as Staffa, Ulva and iconic Iona to explore.

You may also be interested to know, that the majority of our previous volunteers have gone onto visitor engagement, wildlife conservation, other paid work or further study and a few are still living on Mull.
