Striking in landscapes around boulders, elevate off flat ground.




Common Name: Artichoke Agave Botanical Name: Agave parryi var. truncata

Traits: It is an evergreen perennial succulent with dense rosettes, rounded blue-gray leaves with strongly toothed leaf margins, truncated apexes, and a central spine. They will bloom when mature (10-15 years old), from a single central stalk that grows as tall as 5m high, which produces a spike of yellow flowers at the tip. Its characteristic clumping behavior and ability to grow into large masses over time. Striking in landscapes around boulders, elevate off flat ground.

Common Name: Sharkskin Agave Botanical Name: Agave nickelsiae x scabra 'Sharkskin'

Traits: leathery leaves that have the texture of shark skin. This agave develops a rosette of thick, smooth, triangular-shaped, olive-green leaves, with a blue cast. It forms an attractive architectural clump. Its' leaves have a strong terminal spine, smooth edges, and tips that give it an interesting appearance. The agave produces offsets for reproduction later in its lifetime. Attractive in rock gardens for its interesting appearance and symmetrical shape. It can also be used in masses and groupings with other agave plants for interest in the landscape. Needs well drained soil and do not plant on flats but elevate.

Growth Rate: Fast Exposure: Full Sun

Maturity: Maturity can reach 2-3 ft wide and 3-4

Common Name: Octopus Agave Botanical Name: Agave vilmoriniana

Traits: A very unusual looking succulent with narrow green leaves that twist back towards the ground, making it look an octopus with outreaching tentacles. A relatively safe plant for walkway areas or container growing. Tolerates drought and cold temperatures to 24 degrees. As with other Agave the main plant dies after flowering. This plant produces no suckers to replace itself. It does produce many new "plantlets" (or bulbils) within the inflorescence that can perpetuate the plant within the garden. Seems to flower within 7 to 10 years from plants grown from these plantlets . Well drained soil and elevated.

Growth Rate: Fast Exposure: Full Sun



Common Name: Weber Agave Botanical Name: Agave weberi

Traits: This bold agave with grayish-green to shiny, bluish-green, long, fleshy leaves and a sharp spine. The foliage is five to seven inches wide, with fine teeth along the top of the leaf. The foliage produces a large rosette with upright growth. At maturity, this plant creates a twenty- to twenty-six-foot high, branched, flower stalk with clusters of yellow blossoms. It also produces many offsets that help to further propagate the plant. Use it as a focal or accent plant in large, open spaces. Known as the agave that is cultivated for Tequila. Plant away from foot traffic and give plenty of space, needs well drained soil and do not place watering leads directly on plant.

Growth Rate: Fast Exposure: Full Sun

Maturity: Maturity can reach 5 ft high and 5-6 ft





Botanical Name: Aloe barbadensis

Traits: A succulent that range from short-stalked clumps, grows as a flattened, rosette which spreads outward by underground rhizomes and forms a cluster of fleshy leaves edged with short, soft prickles. The leaves are usually 8 to 10 inches long and speckled with patches of light green and gray, giving a mottled appearance. Aloe Vera can be grown outdoors in areas where there is no chance of freezing and produces flowers in the late winter to spring in the desert, attracting hummingbirds. The flower stem is 2 to 3 feet tall and topped with profuse tubular yellow flowers. Sap in leaves are used for burns and cuts. Plant in well-drained soil, look good planted in planter beds and allowed to mass out.

Exposure: Full Sun to partial shade

Maturity: Maturity can reach 2-3 ft high and 18" to 24" wide and clumps will expand as far

Common Name: Blue Elf Aloe Botanical Name: Aloe x 'Blue Elf'

Traits: This aloe is hugely popular, low-water plant for desert landscapes. Preferred for its tight-clumping nature, great for small spaces. It tolerates reflected heat and cold temperatures Spikes of orangish red flowers in early spring and late winter, attracting hummingbirds. Shade grown specimens tend to be greener and shorter than those grown in full sun. Looks great in mass plantings.

Growth Rate: Fast

Exposure: Full Sun to partial shade

Maturity: Maturity can reach 2' ft high and wide



Common Name: Cape Aloe Botanical Name: Aloe ferox

Traits: A tall single-stemmed aloe to 6 to 9+ feet tall with a rosette of dull blue-green 2-3 feet long leaves. The leaf edges, and leaf surface on young plants, are adorned with reddish spines In late fall to mid-winter appear the dark orange flowers with inner white petals that are held above the foliage in a large upright candelabra-like inflorescence with 5 to 8 branches. Plant in full sun and irrigate little to regularly - plants are known to tolerate very dry conditions but look best with occasion irrigation. This plant makes a beautiful and dramatic specimen for a center piece in a garden or planter and is great for attracting nectar-feeding birds.

Common Name: Peruvian apple
Botanical Name: Cereus repandus f.
monstrosa

Traits: This cactus is admired for its knobby branches, flowers that open at night and red, applelike fruit. Characteristics ribbed and cylindricalshaped, deep grayish-green, upright branches. Spines, sharp edges. During the warmer months, the plant produces large, white or reddish and slightly fragrant blossoms that bloom at night. The species is distinguished by the red fruit that remains on the plant for a long time. Its fruit is large, hairless and contains small, edible, crunchy seeds called pitaya. Does best in sandy soils that are well-drained. It likes supplemental water every month or two and less water during the winter months. In frost conditions cover the ends of the plant with Styrofoam cups or sheets to protect it as needed during these periods. Use it as a striking accent against tall buildings or large, open walls.

Eventually it produces a narrow, tall spike of

to walkways or high traffic areas.)



Botanical Name: Echinopsis pachanoi

Traits: Native to Ecuador and Peru. Its stems are light to dark green, sometimes glaucous, the whitish areoles may produce up to seven yellow to brown spines and has multiple branches, usually extending from the base. White flowers are produced at the end of the stems; they open at night and last for about two days and are highly fragrant. Does best in sandy soils that are well-draining. It likes supplemental water every month or two and less water during the winter months. In frost conditions cover the ends of the plant with Styrofoam cups or sheets to protect it as needed during these periods. Use it as a striking accent against tall buildings or large, open walls.

Common Name: Toothless Desert Spoon Botanical Name: Dasylirion longissima

After many years of growth, it develops an insignificant, whitishgreen flower stalk that reaches heights of ten to twelve feet tall. Use it as an attractive desert accent plant in arid or tropical gardens. It can be combined with palms, or plant it in large, decorative containers for a tropical, whimsical effect.

Common Name: Golden Barrel Cactus Botanical Name: Echinocactus grusonii Traits: spiny succulent with light green skin, spines are yellow, and one to two inches long, arranged in evenly spaced clusters along the ribs. Striking cactus comes as a single head or multi. Great accent plant around boulders or used in modern design single heads planted equally spaced in a row. Needs well drained soil and elevated.







This plant makes a great container plant in warm climates but can also grow well in the garden and mass plantings along a wall or in a raised bed can make a dramatic statement. Hummingbirds are attracted by the nectar-rich flowers.





Best us is in a pot cascading over the side and mixed with other succulents and flowing plants.

Botanical Name: Pachycereus marginatus
Traits: known for its columnar trunks. It produces

lifetime, deep green with ribs that have minor spines.
The margins are smooth and have five to seven ribs. In
spring, the cactus produces tubular, pinkish-red flowers
that are very showy. Following the bloom cycle, it
develops spiny, yellowish to red fruit with black
seeds. Use it as a desert accent or specimen; plant it
against a tall wall, as a vertical accent, or create a living
fence from cuttings of this plant.

foliage on mature plants in late spring.
