It was a difficult year to do our traditional fundraising, but two amazing opportunities came our way that allowed us to safely reach our goals.

We sold over 200 tickets in **Dream Raffle 2020**, offering cash prizes in six drawings. The money we raised supported all of our service projects, allowing us to continue the positive impact of mentoring girls of all ages in our community, providing grants to single mothers, aiding those with breast cancer, and funding our other programs.



President Cheryl Abel pulled the six winning tickets, and we thank everyone who took a chance!

The LUNAFEST Film Festival was re-imagined as a virtual event, and we had over 250 people tune in from home in June. One of the filmmakers, Erin Rye, joined us on a podcast with the Manhattan Beach Chamber of Commerce and Jackie Balestra (South Bay by Jackie) for an interview. Erin's insights about the film industry and how women are represented were reflected in her film, "Lady Parts." We missed gathering together for this event but are so glad that our

audience was able to enjoy these wonderful films.

he signature program of Soroptimist is the Live Your Dream Education and Training Awards, for women who provide the main financial support for their families as they work to improve career options through education.

This year our club awarded \$14,000 to four South Bay women. They were enrolled in community colleges in the health care field (3 are becoming nurses) and planning to transfer to four-year schools. These inspiring single mothers used the funds for child care, transportation, and school expenses.

We were unable to hold our annual awards dinner to celebrate with them in person. They submitted video "thank you" messages that we shared with our club members, telling their stories of overcoming obstacles to improve their lives.

This annual program is designed to help girls grow into strong, successful, happy adults. Dream It, Be It workshops assist high school girls who face obstacles to their dreams by providing professional role models, career education, \*personal assessment, and a roadmap for identifying and reaching goals.

Our session this year had 26 girls primarily from Leuzinger and Mira Costa High Schools. They were great participants and loved what they learned, and the women who presented to them. Highlights included a lunchtime panel discussion from five women who overcame obstacles to make successful careers, and a stress-busting session on meditation featuring a "sound bath." It all made for an outstanding day!

The Mira Costa S Club partners with us in making Breast Cancer Comfort Bags, and they volunteered at the California Pizza Kitchen fundraiser. We support their service projects as well, and

donated dozens of feminine hygiene packages for their project with homeless women. In 2021 we are celebrating our 60th year as sponsors of S Club!

We sponsored a new club for middle-school girls, S Club Juniors, who held a clothing collection day for a shelter in Long Beach. These girls are eager for service opportunities and have so much to offer!

### BREAST CANCER COMFORT BAGS

ur club will soon reach a milestone of 3,000 tote bags filled with care items to assist women starting chemotherapy for breast cancer in underserved areas of the South Bay. We receive some donated items and purchase what we need, then assemble the bags at our "packing parties."

We continue to receive feedback about the project and incorporate ideas to increase the usefulness of the donated bags, and to help create a more supportive system. They are delivered to oncology clinics at three

South Bay locations, including the Martin Luther King Jr. Outpatient Center, and the bags are available for other patients upon request.

The Manhattan Beach Police Department raises funds for breast cancer with the Pink Patch Project, and we are grateful for their partnership. Together we hosted two fundraisers at California Pizza Kitchen and they also collected money selling t-shirts and other logo items. They raised over \$4,000 and we were joined at our holiday party by Chief Derrick Abell who presented the check, which enabled us to make and distribute100 additional bags.

We gathered at a specially painted pink lifeguard tower in recognition of Breast Cancer Awareness Month to showcase the project.

For our holiday project we collected over \$1,100 in gift cards for teens in foster care through the DCFS office in Torrance. Marixa Barba delivered them to the agency in time for their holiday party in December 2019.
