Of course--I was like eight years old!

























































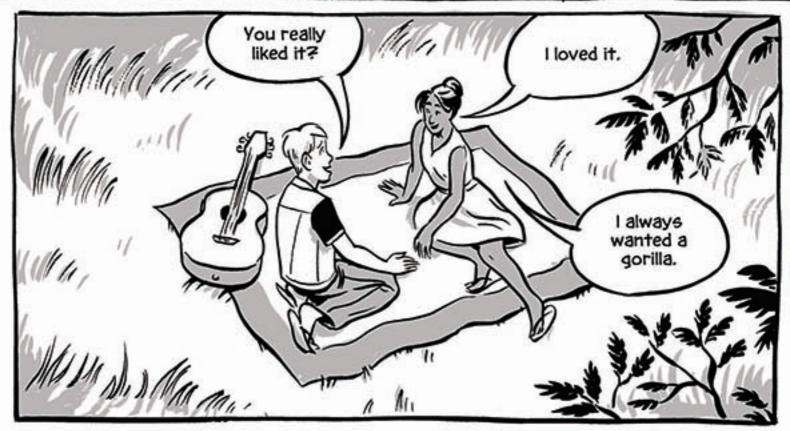
Hi, so I want to order a singing telegram for my girlfriend's birthday...

Day after tomorrow... Yeah, I know it's last minute... You only have WHAT??? Okay, well, I guess it'll do...























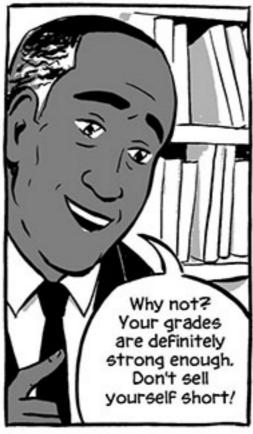
























I've been texting Neela all day, and she's been ignoring me.

Who, Matt? Don't they have physics together? What's the big deal?

















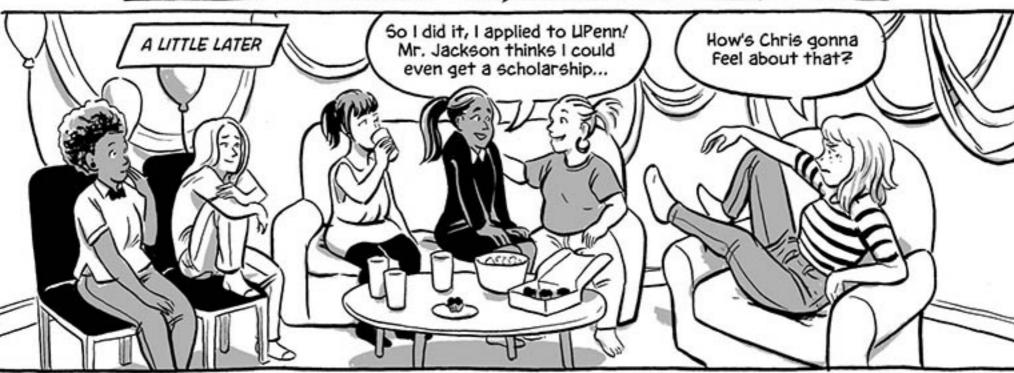

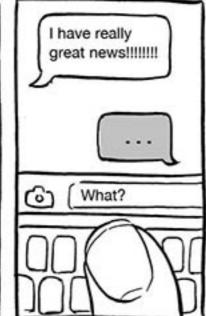














What?

When we were dating, I was so involved in the situation, I couldn't see clearly... I had never been in love before... But now I know, what Chris was doing, trying to manipulate and control me, that's not love, that's abuse. Abuse isn't always physical. It can be emotional, psychological, verbal. Chris wasn't a bad person, but that's what was going on.





My friends. They were so supportive. They didn't judge Chris, but they did help me see how unhealthy the relationship was.

















what you need to know

Stories like Neela's are very common. It is normal to think that dating abuse could never happen to you. But the truth is that anyone can experience dating abuse.

Here's what you need to know:

Dating abuse is common: As many as 1 in 5 girls and 1 in 7 boys experience dating abuse in some form.

Guys experience dating abuse: Dating abuse happens to people of any gender.

It happens in LGBTQ relationships: People of any gender identity or sexual orientation can experience dating abuse.

There are many different kinds of dating abuse.

- Physical punching, slapping, kicking, or shoving
- Emotional name-calling, bullying, shaming, being controlling or possessive, or keeping you away from friends and family
- Sexual forcing or pressuring you to do something sexual
- Stalking repeated harassing or threatening behavior
- Cyber Abuse posting damaging pictures of you online or sending threatening text messages

Breakup violence: Even people who haven't been abusive before may get violent during a breakup. If you're trying to end a relationship and you feel scared, get help from an adult you trust and develop a safety plan.



If your dating partner is abusive, it is not your fault. That's true no matter what your partner tells you. No one deserves to be hurt by a partner for any reason.
