

SCHOOLWIDE ESSAY PROMPT #14

BACKGROUND: March is Women's History Month and while women make up 50% of the population in the United States and the world, they don't always get the credit they deserve for their contributions to society. The celebration of Women's History Month first began as





"Women's History Week" in 1978 but after lobbying for two years, it was changed to a full month by President Jimmy Carter in 1980. Similar to Black History Month, the focus is on the often unrecognized contributions of women to the greater society.

While there may be a month to celebrate these contributions, women continue to suffer the injustice of the financial wage gap in the workforce. Over half a century after the US passed the Equal Pay Act, American women still face a substantial gender wage gap. Overall, women who were full-time, year-round employees made 83 cents for every dollar men made in 2020, based on median earning data from the Census Current Population Survey. That means women are paid about 17% less than men. (Insider.com).

Based on real weekly earnings data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the gap has narrowed over time. In the first quarter of 1979, median weekly earnings for men aged 16 and over working full time was \$408, compared to \$251 for women. That is,


women's weekly earnings were 61.5% of men's weekly earnings. There has been some progress over the years, and in the fourth quarter of 2021 women's weekly earnings were 84.3% of men's weekly earnings. (Top Chart).


Black and Hispanic women are most affected by the wage gap when compared to non-Hispanic white men. Based on 2020 data, Black women made just around 64% of what non-Hispanic white men made. As tracked by the Census Bureau, Hispanic women could be of any race, and their pay gap between non-Hispanic white men is even wider than that of Black women.
