





Case Manager Danny and Transitional Coordinator Eduardo took a walk around the neighborhood near the office, where they encountered 62-year-old Antonio Brewer, who was currently unhoused. Antonio was diligently keeping the area around his tent clean when Case Manager Danny asked him if he was interested in finding a job. Antonio expressed his willingness, but unfortunately, he lacked the necessary identification documents required for employment. Struggling with this issue despite assistance from several Case Workers from different entities, Antonio displayed incredible determination. After months of hard work, on 3/21/24, he successfully obtained his California ID, birth certificate, and social security card. This milestone now positions him to seek assistance that could lead to acquiring housing. Antonio's behavioral health Case Manager, Fabian (formerly of Reinvest 5 Keys), is actively working with Antonio to secure his SSI and housing, ensuring that Antonio receives the support crucial to his well-being.
