MORGAN HILL, Calif., April 24, 2019 – The Specialized Foundation today announced 41 new middle school grant recipients for the 2019-2020 Riding for Focus school program. With the addition of these new schools, The Specialized Foundation will now support more than 33,000 new students next year, across 130 schools, in 45 states and Canada. The program integrates cycling into the physical education curriculum as a means to help students achieve academic, health, and social success.
