Also referred to as *The Battle of Atlanta Painting*, this hyperbolic artifact, one of only two remaining in the U.S., was created in 1886 as a tribute to Northern victory at the close of the American Civil War and was moved to Atlanta in 1892. It will be relocated from Grant Park to the Atlanta History Center where it will be restored and combined with the nation's most comprehensive collection of Civil War artifacts.

One of the nation's largest history museums, this 33-acre complex consists of an 83 thousand sq. ft. museum, with exhibits on the Civil War, folk crafts, black enterprise, Jewish legacies, and more; the Swan House, an elegant 1928 classically styled Italianate mansion; the Tullie Smith Farm, an 1840s plantation house; McElreath Hall, featuring a research library/archives and alternating exhibits; the Grand Overlook events facility; the Swan Coach House restaurant; the Swan Woods Trail, and seven different gardens with educational or historical themes. In 2013, the newly-expanded Veterans Park was dedicated to all the men and women who have served – and continue to serve – the United States of America. Adults \$16.50; senior citizens (65+), students 13-18 and college students with valid ID \$13; children 4-12 \$11; free to members and children under 4; group rates on request. ## Fort Peach Tree

This 15-acre greenspace, a replica of the original, first non-Indian settlement in Atlanta, was built by the City of Atlanta's Department of Watershed Management as part of the bicentennial celebration. The Fort was originally constructed, on this site, in 1814 during the War of 1812 by 1st Lt. George Rockingham Gilmer, later a two-term Georgia Governor, to protect the "frontier" of Georgia from the Creek Indians who were allied with the British. This area has been recreated for tourists in a diorama, located inside the Fort, which was scaled from an 1890 topographical map.
