Cyril, monk, died 869; **Methodius**, bishop, died 885; Friday, February 14, 2020 Missionaries to the Slavs, these two brothers from Thessalonika, Greece, were monks and were sent to bring Christianity to the Slavic people. In the course of their work they created a written language, inventing the Cyrillic alphabet for it, and translated the Bible and the liturgy.
