 <p>Age: 10 years and up</p> <p>Level I Date: April</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Only for students learning German as a foreign language and those without prior knowledge. <p>There is no extra preparation needed for those test; normal classroom participation is sufficient.</p>
 <p>Age: 10 years and up</p> <p>Level II, III and IV Date: Dec.-Jan.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • USA Nationwide recognized Testing of German Language Skills • Administered by The American Association of Teachers of German • Recognized by high school nationwide, which offer the same testing. • These examinations are designed to assess students' proficiency nationwide. They are also used as a teaching tool. About 25,000 students participate every year. <p>There is no extra preparation needed for those test; normal classroom participation is sufficient.</p>
<p>A1 Age: 7/8 years</p> <p>A2 Age: 12-18 years</p>  <p>Date: Feb.-Apr.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provides proof of German language proficiency at the A1 level • Provides proof of German language proficiency at the A2 level • Provides career advantages when applying for Jobs <p>Students taking this exam will receive a specialized/customized preparation for those tests during class.</p>
<p>B1 Age: 14-19 years</p>  <p>Date: Mar.-Apr.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provides proof of German language proficiency required for admission to many post-secondary institutions such as "Studienkollegs" in Germany • Provides advantages when applying to study in Germany. • A2/B1 Students who pass this test are qualified to enroll in a German language college preparatory class (Studienkolleg) that is generally offered at German universities. This course is separate from regular university course work. Students passing the A2/B1 test can attend this preparatory course without taking the entrance exam that is normally required. <p>Students taking this exam will receive a specialized/customized preparation for those tests during class.</p>
<p>B2/C1 Age: 16-21 years</p>  <p>Date: January</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provides proof of German language proficiency required for admission to post-secondary institutions such as German universities. • Passing the B2/C1 Exam satisfies the German language requirement to enroll in a German university. <p>Students taking this exam will receive a specialized/customized preparation for those tests during class.</p>
<p>AP Exam Age: 10th grade in high school</p>  <p>Date: May</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The AP exam is recognized by German universities and acknowledges the student's language ability. • The AP German course is designed to be the equivalent to a third-year college course. Some colleges require a 4 or a 5 for credit. More than 2,900 universities and colleges worldwide give credit for this test. <p>Students taking this exam will receive a specialized/customized preparation for those tests during class.</p>
