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Albany High School

School Profile 2017-18

Community Albany is an urban residential town of approximately one square mile, located in the San Francisco/East Bay Area. For a small community, Albany has a diverse population, due in part to the fact that UC Berkeley's family housing complex is located within Albany USD. Thirty-two percent of Albany residents are foreign born, and 69% have completed a bachelor's or graduate degree. Many families are attracted to Albany because of its strong support for education.

School Albany High School is the only comprehensive high school in the Albany Unified School District. It has 1140 students in grades 9 through 12. The school offers seven periods per day, two semesters per academic year. Each semester is a minimum of 18 weeks. We use a modified block schedule with all classes meeting on Monday for 51 minutes, odd periods meeting Tues/Thurs and even periods meeting on Wed/Fri. Block schedule periods are 94 minutes long.

Students The school has a diverse racial, ethnic, and cultural population, composed of approximately 37% White, 30% Asian/Pacific Islander, 4% African-American, 17% Hispanic/Latino, and 10% 2 or more races. We have 9% English Learners and 25% fluent-English proficient students. At least 18% of students qualify for the Free/Reduced Price Lunch Program. The graduation rate is 93%.

Faculty and Staff The teaching faculty includes 64 classroom teachers (52 full-time and 12 part-time), 37 of whom hold graduate degrees. The pupil-teacher ratio is 20 to 1. There are 4 administrators and 5 guidance counselors, 2 of whom work part time.

Grade Point Average

AHS grades on a 4.0 scale: A=4.0, B=3.0, C=2.0, D=1.0, F=0.0. Total GPA (9-12) includes all grades; Academic GPA includes grades for all UC/CSU "a-g" approved college prep courses.

Grade Point Averages are weighted. AP and Honors courses are assigned an extra grade point: A=5.0, B=4.0, C=3.0. D grades are not assigned the extra grade point. We provide class rank by decile. Mid-year reports include 7th semester grades. The highest GPA (9th-11th grade) for the class of 2017 is 4.37 weighted and the median is 3.58.

Please note: Courses taken outside of Albany High School, including community college courses, are not listed on our transcript or counted in the AHS GPA or class rank.

College recommending marks are A, B and C.

Honor Roll/Principal's List

Students qualify for the Honor Roll each semester they earn a 3.0-3.49 total GPA, and for the Principal's List each semester with 3.5 and above.

Curriculum Advanced Placement courses are offered in English Lit., French, Mandarin, Spanish, Calculus AB & BC, Statistics, Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Science, Physics, Art History, Studio Art, Computer Science, and Comparative Government. Honors courses are offered in English 3, Pre-Calculus and Art. Advanced courses are offered in Art, Instrumental Music, Vocal Music, Photography, and Journalism. Special programs include EDSET (Environmental Design, Society, English, and Technology), a two-year program for 11th and 12th grade; Venture, a small school business and design academy for 10th through 12th grade; and Design + Build, a physics and CAD curriculum that includes fieldwork in a college fab lab. EDSET and Venture both include internship experiences.

Advanced Placement This past school year '16-'17, 299 students participated in the AP testing with 645 individual scores reported. 86% of students earned scores of 3 or above with 33% earning a score of 5. Students are strongly encouraged to limit their course selection to a maximum of three AP and/or honors courses during any one year. With very limited exceptions, no AP courses are available to students before 11th grade.

Recognition Albany High School was named a California Distinguished School in 2011 and a Gold Ribbon School in 2015. We are accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges through 2019. We were awarded the Civic Learning Award of Distinction in 2013 for outstanding civic engagement. The class of 2017 included 28 National Merit Commended Students and 5 National Merit Finalists. Our Instrumental and Vocal Music Ensembles, Debate, Science Bowl, Robotics, Technovation and Model U.N. teams, service clubs, and athletic teams are consistently awarded for outstanding performance and academic achievement. On the 2017 SBAC, 84% of students met or exceeded standards in English and 75% in math.
