Our Story

BACH is Champaign-Urbana's premier chamber choir. Joseph Baldwin is its second Music Director, succeeding Chester L. Alwes in 2017. The Baroque Artists of Champaign-Urbana, Illinois ("BACH") was founded as a project-based professional ensemble in 1996 for teaching, learning, and performing music of the Baroque era. Now a thriving nonprofit community organization, BACH is proud of the diverse range of its repertoire—from its roots in Baroque music to today's most exciting new works by living composers. Today's audiences enjoy programs featuring both favorite Baroque masterpieces and leading works from across the entire choral repertory.


