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SYNOPSIS

Babel "Babs" Johnson (Adewale Akinnuoye-Agbaje) is a police detective who finds himself assigned to a precinct in the Wetlands, the no-man's land surrounding Atlantic City, within eyeshot of the fancy hotels and boardwalk, but a world away. With a new partner, a fun-loving gambling addict named Paddy Sheehan (Christopher MacDonald), Babs adjust slowly back to life on the beat. A year ago, he was a top cop in Philadelphia, but a secret drug problem and connections to a murdered dealer landed him in rehab. Now sober, he's eager to try to connect with his pre-teen daughter, Amy (Celeste O'Connor), which means dealing with his still-bitter ex, Savannah (Heather Graham).

Savannah's new love is known as Surfer Girl (Reyna de Courcy), a surfboard builder who has dreams of moving to Hawaii to ply her trade. Surfer Girl makes some money on the side selling drugs for a local thug, Jimmy (Louis Mustillo), and when she rips him off, Jimmy threatens Amy, who often hangs out with Surfer Girl. Watching over his daughter like a hawk, even though their moments of contact are awkward, Babs confronts both Surfer Girl and Jimmy, warning them to leave his daughter out of their dispute. Meanwhile, as the region prepares for a massive, late-season hurricane, Babs finds that the only one he can be vulnerable with is his partner Paddy's wife, Kate (Jennifer Ehle), a local news anchor who is tired of her aging husband's careless behavior.

As the storm approaches, Surfer Girl contemplates one big move against the abusive Jimmy, only to have her plan thwarted by Babs, who has been following her. Though at first it seems like violence can be avoided, the next day a body washes up in a local swamp, turning the eye of suspicion to the new cop with the violent past. Babs must act quickly to solve the murder and clear his name before his own weaknesses and poor decisions from the past overtake and destroy him.

LOGLINE

As a major storm approaches the outskirts of Atlantic City, a newly sober police detective goes to extreme measures to make sure that his estranged family does not fall victim to the vengeance of a local crime lord.

QUICK TAKES FROM THE FILMMAKER

I was born in a small seaside resort town in Italy. The way the tourists move out just before the dark clouds of winter arrive has always fascinated me, coupled with the eerie desolation on the boardwalk and the once glistening streets turning gritty with crime and hustle.

I wanted to be a filmmaker my entire life. My father started feeding me the great American films of the 60's and 70's and introduced me to Italian Neorealism at an impressionable age. I've been lucky to be surrounded by older friends who happened to be directors, writers, producers, art directors – these friendships allowed for a kind of film school. Watching them work has been an incredible treasure.

About 15 years ago, I started hanging out in Atlantic City and the Wetlands. After spending time there, the memories of my seaside youth came flooding back on steroids. Without a doubt, this place was going to be the first character of the story I wanted to tell.

WETLANDS is heavily influenced by my love for American culture: the paintings of Hopper, all of the great "on the road" photography of the past 50 years, the jazz music and most importantly, the great noir films that are so hard to find today.

CAST BIOS

ADEWALE AKINNUOYE-AGBAJE

Adewale Akinnuoye-Agbaje (Ada-Wall-Ay Aka-Noy-Ay Ag-Baj-Ayaka) "Triple A" has become one of the most versatile actors of his generation, jumping seamlessly between acting in film and television as well as behind the scenes as writer, producer and director, with a commanding presence on & off screen that creates iconic and memorable characters.

Adewale is currently starring as the 2nd lead/male lead opposite Kyra Sedgwick in the new ABC thriller, "Ten Days in the Valley." The series follows overworked television producer and single mother Jane Sadler (Sedgwick) in the middle of a fractious separation when her young daughter goes missing in the middle of the night, Jane's world - and her controversial police series - implodes. Adewale plays Detective John Bird, who is assigned to the case to find his missing daughter. During his working of the case an attraction develops between the two characters. The show premieres Sundays this Fall 10pm ET/PT.

In addition to Ten Days... Adewale can next be seen as one of the stars of the independent feature about mental health, entitled *Elizabeth Blue*. Global Digital Releasing recently acquired worldwide rights to writer/director Vincent Sabella's feature film debut. The drama also stars Anna Schafer, Ryan Vincent, and Kathleen Quinlan. The story centers on the titular Elizabeth — played by Schafer — who suffers from schizophrenia and is struggling to regain control of her mental stability and her life as she begins to plan her wedding. It's set for a limited theatrical release on September 22nd in a minimum of 10 major markets, including New York and Los Angeles. The release strategy also includes an exclusive worldwide release on

iTunes on Oct. 10 in conjunction with World Mental Health Day. In addition, the film is scheduled to screen at multiple NAMI affiliate locations across the country during the film's opening weekend.

Adeyemi will be making his motion picture directorial debut with *Farming*, a film he also wrote. Based on Adeyemi's childhood, *Farming* tells the story of a young Nigerian boy, 'farmed out' by his parents to a white British family in the hope of a better future. Instead, he becomes the feared leader of a white skinhead gang. The film has garnered an all-star cast that consists of newcomer Damson Idris (FX's *Snowfall*) playing the lead character. The film also stars Adeyemi, Kate Beckinsale (*The Only Living Boy in NYC*, *Underworld*), and Gugu Mbatha-Raw (*Beyond the Lights*, *Beauty & the Beast*). Production has started in the UK and the film will be released in 2018 TBD.

On the TV front, Adeyemi can currently be seen in a strong supporting role in the hilarious HBO mockumentary, "Tour De Pharmacy" that is currently set to air on the cable network. Most recently in the motion picture arena, he played 'Killer Croc' in the Warner Bros film *Suicide Squad* where he starred alongside Jared Leto, Will Smith, Viola Davis and Margot Robbie.

Adeyemi was nominated for a 2017 Screen Actors Guild (SAG) award for "Outstanding Performance by a Cast in a Motion Picture" for his work in *Trumbo* alongside Bryan Cranston, John Goodman and Helen Mirren. He also recently co-starred in the critically acclaimed film *Concussion* portraying 'Dave Duerson' opposite Will Smith.

Television audiences were first captivated by Adeyemi's talent in the ground breaking HBO original "Oz", which received widespread critic and audience acclaim. For three seasons Adeyemi played the heavily flawed character 'Simon Adebisi,' a murderous drug addict with intellect and brawn. His portrayal earned him two NAACP nominations for "Outstanding Actor in a Drama Series" (2000) and "Outstanding Supporting Actor in a Drama Series" (2001).

On the heels of "Oz's" success, Adeyemi switched gears and took on the challenge of the big screen in the giant blockbuster *The Mummy Returns*. He followed with another big hit, *The Bourne Identity*, where he played 'Wombosi' alongside Matt Damon in the iconic Jason Bourne action series. Adeyemi then went on to co-star opposite Curtis "50 Cent" Jackson in *Get Rich or Die Tryin'* directed by Academy Award nominated Jim Sheridan; playing 'Majestic,' a brutally twisted drug lord.

Returning to the small screen in 2006, Adeyemi joined the cast of the hugely popular show "Lost" in its second season. The show's rabid fan base was quick to embrace the mysterious 'Mr. Eko,' and week after week he had the audience enthralled with his gripping portrayal. Adeyemi and the cast won the highly coveted "Outstanding Performance by an Ensemble in a Drama Series" award at both the Golden Globes and Screen Actors Guild (SAG) that year. He was also nominated for a Saturn award for his performance as 'Mr. Eko.'

Jumping back into film, Adeyemi joined the international box office hit "Thor: The Dark World", where he played the dual villain roles of dark elves 'Algrim' and 'Kurse'. The film grossed over \$600 million, making it one of the biggest films of 2013. That same year, Adeyemi showed a different side of him in the independent film "The Inevitable Defeat of Mister & Pete" where he starred alongside Academy Award Winner Jennifer Hudson.

Adewale's other film credits include: *G.I Joe: The Rise of Cobra*, *Ace Ventura 2: When Nature Calls*, *Congo*, *Unstoppable*, *Pompeii*, *Annie*, *Killer Elite*, alongside Robert DeNiro, Clive Owen and Jason Statham, and Universal Pictures classic remake of *The Thing*. His other memorable television credits include the NBC conspiracy thriller series "American Odyssey," as well as the HBO epic fantasy series "Game of Thrones."

Akinnuoye-Agbaje was born to Nigerian parents of Yoruba origin, who were students in the UK. At six weeks old, he was given up to a white working-class family in Tilbury, Essex, where he joined eight other Nigerian foster-children, including his two sisters. Growing up in Tilbury as the only black family, young Adewale was subjected to constant racial abuse. His foster-parents lived in extreme poverty, and his father worked as a lorry driver and struggled to support the family. When he was eight years old, his biological parents took him back to Nigeria. Unable to speak the Yoruba language and unaccustomed to his new environment, he withdrew into himself and refused to talk. Disturbed by his inability to assimilate himself into Nigerian culture, he was sent back to Tilbury. This brief exposure to Nigeria left Adewale struggling to reconcile his heritage with the working-class English culture he was raised in. Facing an identity crisis and searching for a sense of belonging, he joined a gang. At 16 years old, his Nigerian parents intervened, sending him to a boarding school in Surrey. Faced with the new challenge of adapting to yet another foreign environment, Akinnuoye-Agbaje turned his life around. He went on to graduate with an LLB from the University of London International Programmes, and later completed a Masters in Law at King's College London.

Going from the transitional difficulties of childhood to a career of international acclaim shows character and determination that will inspire many to achieve similar goals. This was ultimately recognized by the decision to award him an *Honorary Doctor of Literature Honoris Causa* at the University of London graduation ceremony in March of 2017.

Adewale resides in the UK and Los Angeles.

HEATHER GRAHAM

Heather Graham discovered her passion for acting at an early age and caught the attention of filmmakers with her breakout role in Gus Van Sant's *Drugstore Cowboy*, for which she received an Independent Spirit Award nomination. Graham went on to score unforgettable roles in the 1997 classic *Boogie Nights*, for which she received the MTV Movie Award for Best Breakthrough Performance, 1999's *Austin Powers: a The Spy Who Shagged Me* and starred opposite Bradley Cooper and Zach Galifinakis in 2009's *The Hangover*.

Next up, Graham will star opposite Edie Falco in NBC's *Law & Order True Crime: The Menendez Murders*. The eight-episode anthology series is based on the famed murder case of brothers Lyle and Erik Menendez in the early 1990s.

Additionally, Graham has completed *Half Magic*, a film she wrote, directed, produced and stars in. This raunchy, female-driven comedy follows the three women set out on a hilarious search for self-fulfillment while overcoming the roadblocks in their personal and professional lives.

Her upcoming films also include Dwight Little's *The Last Rampage*, based on the true story of murderer Gary Tison's attempted escape from prison to Mexico, and Emanuele Della Valle's noir drama *Wetlands*, opposite Adewale Akinnuoye-Agbaje.

Recently, Graham voiced the Lionsgate animated film, *Norm of the North*, alongside Ken Jeong and Rob Schneider and starred alongside Ellen Burstyn in Lifetime's *Flowers in The Attic*, and its sequel, *Petals on the Wind*. The films, based on the famous novels by V.C. Andrews were instant hits, garnering the network one of its highest rated original movie performances of recent years. Graham reprised her role in the third installment, *If There Be Thorns*, which premiered in April 2015.

In April 2014, Graham joined the cast of Showtime's *Californication* for its seventh season. Graham played a woman from Hank's (David Duchovny) past whose arrival upended his life.

In May 2013, Graham reprised her role as Jade in the hit comedy *The Hangover 3*, released on May 20, 2013. She also co-starred in Ramin Bahrani's *At Any Price*, which debuted at the Toronto and Venice Film Festivals, and released nationwide on April 26, 2013. Graham's character finds herself caught between her lover, Dennis Quaid, and his son, played by Zac Efron, while coming to terms with her small-town life.

Graham has starred in *About Cherry* (2012) *Judy Moody and the Not Bummer Summer*, and *5 Days of War* (2011). She also starred with a stellar ensemble in Emilio Estevez's *Bobby*, about the assassination of Robert F. Kennedy, which premiered at the 2006 AFI Film Festival.

Throughout her career, Graham has worked with some of the industry's most respected actors and directors. Her performances include that of a doe-eyed girl in *Swingers*, with Jon Favreau and Vince Vaughn; an ambitious young actress in Frank Oz's *Bowfinger* with Steve Martin and Eddie Murphy; and the tragic Mary Kelly in *Albert and Allen Hughes' From Hell* opposite Johnny Depp, as well as roles in *The Guru* with Marisa Tomei; *Hope Springs* opposite Colin Firth; *Committed* with Luke Wilson; Ed Burns' ensemble *Sidewalks of New York*; James Toback's *Two Girls and a Guy* with Robert Downey Jr.; *Lost in Space* with Gary Oldman and William Hurt; and *Six Degrees of Separation* starring Will Smith.

Graham executive produced and starred in the feature film *Cake*, a romantic comedy also starring Sandra Oh and Cheryl Hines. In 2004-2005, she received rave reviews for her guest starring stint on NBC's critically acclaimed series *Scrubs*. On stage, Graham made her theatrical debut off-Broadway in Playwrights Horizons' *Recent Tragic Events*.

CHRISTOPHER MCDONALD

The New York Times cited Christopher McDonald as one of the most prolific actors working in Hollywood, co-starring in over 100 movies as well maintaining a constant presence in television and on Broadway. He was born in New York City, (the middle of seven children), and grew up in Romulus, a small town in upstate New York. He first attended undergraduate school at Hobart and William Smith Colleges in Geneva, NY and later studied at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art in London and the Stella Adler Acting Conservatory in NYC.

An award-winning stage actor with over 40 plays/musicals to his credit, Chris is currently co-starring as the owner of the Dallas Cowboys in HBO's hit *Ballers*. In 2016 he finished an arc on *The Good Wife* as Judge Don Schakowsky, the corrupt nemesis to Julianna Margulies, and was featured as a 'ripped from the headlines' guest star on the long running hit *Law & Order SVU*. In 2016 Chris played Broadway again in the hit production of the American Comedy Classic, *THE FRONT PAGE* with Nathan Lane and John Goodman.

Chris spent four and a half months in Durango, Mexico for the mini series, *Texas Rising* directed by Roland Joffe and co-starred with Jeremy Sumpter in the feature film *The Squeeze*, currently on the GOLF Channel. Television favorite roles include US Attorney General Harry Daugherty in HBO's hit *Boardwalk Empire* as well as a series regular role Tommy Jefferson in David E. Kelley's *Harry's Law* opposite Kathy Bates. His voice work includes Brad Bird's *The Iron Giant* and *The Batman* and *Superman* series. He has co-starred in such films as

Grease 2 (1982), *Dutch* (1991), *Thelma & Louise* (1991), *Quiz Show* (1994) and *Requiem for a Dream* (2000). He is often recognized as golf pro Shooter McGavin from *Happy Gilmore* (1996). Chris resides in Southern California and New York City.

JENNIFER EHLE

Jennifer Ehle is a two time Tony Award winner for her performances in Tom Stoppard's *THE REAL THING*, directed by David Leveaux and *THE COAST OF UTOPIA*, directed by Jack O'Brien. Jennifer most recently starred in J.T. Rogers' 2017 Tony Award winning Broadway play *OSLO*, directed by Bartlett Sher, for which she was nominated for a Tony for Best Lead Actress in a Play.

Ehle can currently be seen in Ira Sachs' *LITTLE MEN*, *THE REVISED FUNDAMENTALS OF CAREGIVING* (written and directed by Rob Burnett) –both of which were selected for Sundance Film Festival last year – Kathryn Bigelow's *DETROIT* and Terence Davies's *A QUIET PASSION* opposite Cynthia Nixon. In 2018 she will be seen in Anders Walter's *I KILL GIANTS*, opposite Zoe Saldana and Imogen Poots, Desiree Akhavan's *THE MISEDUCATION OF CAMERON POST* opposite Chloe Grace Moretz, and Farhad Safinia's *THE PROFESSOR AND THE MADMAN*, opposite Natalie Dormer, Mel Gibson and Sean Penn.

Jennifer has won a BAFTA Award for playing Jane Austen's "Lizzie Bennet", opposite Colin Firth, in the classic miniseries *PRIDE AND PREJUDICE*, directed by Simon Langton and was nominated for a BAFTA for her performance in Brian Gilbert's *WILDE*, with Stephen Fry.

Ehle's other notable film credits include: Tom Hooper's multi-Academy Award-winning *THE KING'S SPEECH*, Kathryn Bigelow's *ZERO DARK THIRTY*, Steven Soderbergh's *CONTAGION*, George Clooney's *THE IDES OF MARCH*, Neil LaBute's *POSSESSION*, István Szabó's *SUNSHINE*; and Sam Taylor-Johnson's *FIFTY SHADES OF GREY*.
