HOW TO APPLY

The architecture at the edge summer school is open to anyone with a background in architecture, design or construction based in Ireland.

Participation in the workshops is limited to max 12 places, each at a subsidised cost of 500 Euro (inc. VAT). (We will ask for a deposit of €100, refundable in the event that the summer school cannot take place, or on evidence of a compelling need to cancel.)

Those interested in applying for a place on the 2021 Architectural & Design Summer School should carefully follow the instructions outlined below;

Subject: SUMMER SCHOOL 21 APPLICATION (emails without this exact subject will be missed)

PLEASE INCUDE IN THE APPLICATION THE FOLLOWING:

1. A brief Statement of Interest (c 150 words) describing the aspect of architecture they find most interesting, intriguing.

2. A portfolio is required for application.

There is a limited number of places available. It is important for us to see examples of your work to help us make our final selection. In the application please provide a link to your website or a pdf of your work which we can review.

3. A copy your current CV (max 2 pages).

Your CV and Statement of Interest should be attached as a word document or pdf – please do not send Wetransfer or Google Drive download links.

There is likely to be considerable competition for the limited places available, so this supporting material will be a key part of the selection process.

The deadline for applications is Midnight (GMT) on 07 June 2021; successful applicants will be informed by 11 June 2021.
