WE BLESSED SINGLE MOMS

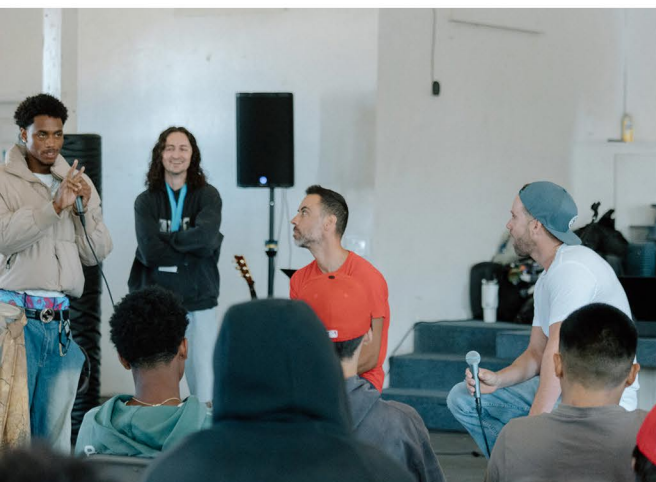

WE BEGAN SUPPORT IN ZIMBABWEE

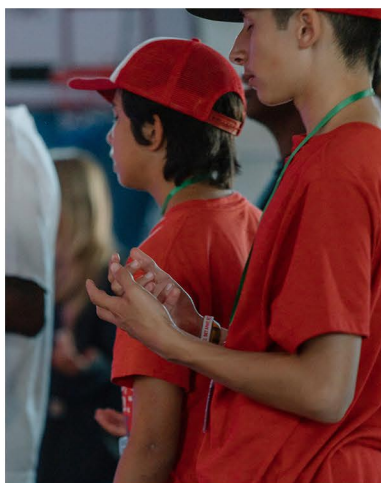
Over a period of two weeks, our team successfully engaged with approximately 130 individuals with albinism in Epworth Suburb and at the Copota School for the Blind. We provided each person with essential sunscreen lotion and, most importantly, offered a ministry of presence, listening to and documenting their powerful testimonies. The challenges they face are profound, spanning severe health risks, deep-seated social stigma, and significant educational and institutional neglect. Despite this, one of the community leaders shared, “In all my years working with the Albino community, I have never seen an organization, church or even the Zimbabwean government—invest this much in purchasing sunscreen lotion to partner with people with albinism.”





WE HELPED STUDENTS GO TO CAMP

A two day retreat where they grew deeper in their faith and left some things at the cross. One of our leaders shared that "Students felt like family and got to experience how much God loves them at camp. It was time where students were set free from many things holding them back so that they could walk more in the freedom and life God has for them. I saw students forgive people they never thought they would, be honest about their lives, and just choose Jesus."

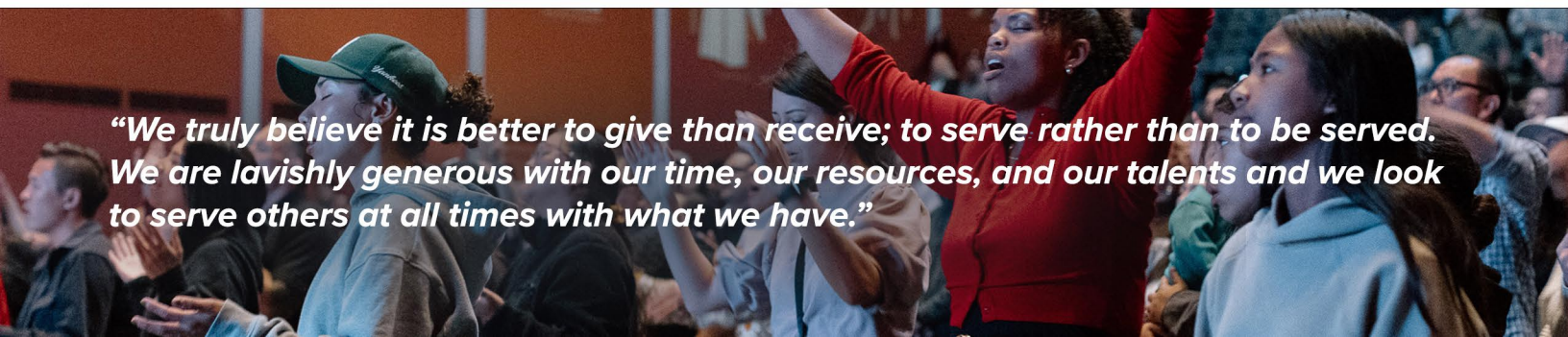


WE SPONSORED A CAMP IN THE MIDDLE EAST

Every summer, Heart of Mercy — one of our ministry partners — hosts a series of camps for the children they serve at their hope centers. This year, TFH not only had the privilege of sponsoring one of those camps, but also of participating in it firsthand. Pastor Tim and his daughter, Ellie, spent a week in Amman, Jordan, serving alongside Heart of Mercy and sharing the love of Jesus with a group of predominantly Muslim teenagers. It was a powerful time of ministry, marked by genuine connection, compassion, and seeds of hope being planted in young hearts.
