


### Average annual employment growth

Riverina SA4




# Unemployment in the Riverina has been steadily increasing since 2016...

Unemployment rate, Riverina SA4




### ...and there is variability across the Riverina

#### The structure of the workforce is also changing


Share of total employment, main employing industries, Riverina RDA

Age profile of employed persons, 2001 and 2016, Riverina RDA




### Many workers are approaching retirement

Proportion of workers aged 55 years and over, Riverina RDA




#### A broad shift towards higher skilled jobs



Internet Vacancy Index, Murray Riverina




## Agriculture output is growing



Across Australia, exports grew by 20.5%


**▲ 16.3%**

#### Of employers surveyed in the Riverina RDA in 2017:




27% expect to increase staff numbers over the next 12 months
