- 1.20 Now, with his flag like a monkey, Arjuna saw your sons, his own first cousins, arrayed for battle, eager to fight, and raised his bow.
- 1.26 Then Arjuna saw stationed there fathers and grandfathers, teachers, maternal uncles, brothers and sons and grandsons, and friends, as well.

Arjuna speaks:

- 1.36 "What pleasure will be ours, Krishna, by slaying my blind uncle's sons? Only sin would come upon us by killing all these murderers.
- 1.39 "Why should we, who can see the fault in destroying the family, not turn back from this wickedness, Krishna, You Who Helps the People?"
- 1.47 Thus having spoken, Arjuna sat in his chariot seat on the battlefield, throwing down bow and arrows, mind full of sorrow.

Krishna speaks:

- 2.11 While you seem to speak wise words, you are mourning for those who should not be mourned. The truly wise ones do not mourn the living nor the dead.
- 2.16 The unreal has no being; the real does not cease to be. The line between these two is seen by those who see Reality.
- 4.42 Thus, with the sword of knowledge, cut out doubt of your Self born from the ignorance living in your heart.
